Then will depart Martinez via Highway 4 to Interstate 80 and to Oakland. Approximate arrival at Boatel 5:00 p.m.

Group will be picked up on Tuesday at the Boatel at approximately 6:50 a.m. and taken to Sambo's, Jack London Square, for 7 a.m. breakfast meeting with Oakland District Office representatives. At about 8a.m., accompanied by representative from the Oakland Office, group will tour the West Oakland areawhich will include yard areas, TOFC ramp area, PMT facility, auto ramps, 7th Street container facility, etc.

From Sambo's we travel along 3rd Street and the WP main line.

At the Adeline overpass, on the left is Schnitzer Steel, exporter of scrap metals. This 50-acre plant shreds 800 to 1,000 auto bodies per day into scrap in addition to other scrap materials they ship.

On the right is the West Oakland yard and the piggy ramp. The ramp covers 10 acres and has two tracks to work from, one track holds 25 cars, the other holds 21. We have handled up to 468 vans in one 24-hour period.

On the left there is the WP yard and ramp area. Adjacent to WP yard is Seatrain Lines. Seatrain is located on Port of Oakland property. It covers 45 acres and has space for 1,000 containers on chassis and the berthing space is 1,300 feet long which will accommodate two vessels.

Next you will see the Middle Harbor complex, owned by the Port of Oakland. This 40-acre plot has two cranes and will soon host U. S. Lines in one area and the second will be operated by Marine Terminals Corp. as a public container port.

On the right you can see Commercial Carriers, agent for Chrysler Corp. Their capacity is 950 autos in their yard. During 1973 we handled 3,234 cars TC inbound.

On the left is the U. S. Naval Supply Center. Their traffic amounted to 349 inbound and 19 outbound cars during 1973.

On the right is the PMT auto facility. Also in this facility is GM Logistics. GM Logistics directs the distribution of GM auto products in the Bay Area by PMT, and Insured Transporters handles the trucks for GM. This facility has six tracks with a capacity for 24 spots on each track. During 1973 we handled 4,474 carloads of autos inbound for GM Logistics and 1,943 carloads of trucks. Stac-Pac and Verta-Pac cars are also handled in this area.

On the other side of the auto ramp you can see the PMT Terminal. This 100,000 square foot complex has a 16-car spot. About one-third of the warehouse is devoted to Terminal Freight and the balance to PMT operations.

Next is Kenosha Auto Transport, agent for AMC Products in the Bay Area, and during 1973 we handled 674 TC inbound cars into this facility.

On the left there is Ringsby Trucking. These people are Plan I shippers. During 1973 we received about 30 shipments from Ringsby.

On the right is UCD, a division of U. S. Freight. This freight forwarder shipped during 1973 total of 1,702 carloads inbound and 247 outbound. UCD co-loads with MSA and Stor-Dor in San Francisco, also members of U. S. Freight System.

The next firm is Oakland Distribution Terminal, operated by Marine Terminals Corp. This 135,000 square foot warehouse has a 7-car spot. We do mostly TOFC work with ODT.

Next is Carnation Co. This facility is principally a transit point and dog food processing plant. Their car capacity is 24 cars at a time, and during 1973 they shipped 2,421 cars outbound and received 870 cars inbound.

Port of Oakland's Seventh Street Terminal is a 140-acre complex with eight berths serving 14 steamship lines. The terminal is in three sections operated by Matson Terminals, Oakland Container Terminal, and Marine Terminals Corp.

As'we drive down Maritime Street, we see the Oakland Army Base or MOTBA (Military Ocean Terminal Bay Area) warehouses. Traffic for 1973 was 532 inbound and 176 outbound for MOTBA.

Next is the Sea-Land Terminal. This 70-acre facility is the largest container line serving the Port. There are two berths served by four cranes. They have space to store 2,000 containers, plus their own CFS on the premises. During 1973 we handled 559 inbound and 160 outbound units, and 1974 shows signs of being at a much higher volume.

Next large building on the left is MOTBA headquarters offices and also the headquarters of WA-MTM&TS (Western Area-Military Traffic Management & Terminal Service). WA-MTM&TS is the control agency for all Government and military traffic originating in 14 western states.

Tour will continue down Maritime to West Grand thence Cypress St. to the Nimitz Freeway (Highway 17) south to the Fruitvale Ave. off ramp. Left on Fruitvale to San Leandro St. where they will turn right and

continue down San Leandro St. south where they will view the highly competitive SP-WP joint drill area. (see N/U)

At Davis St. tour will turn right going west on Davis St. past our San Leandro and Mulford agencies. At this point it should be noted that we have two main lines out of Oakland into San Jose. The east line runs through San Leandro, Hayward, Niles and Warm Springs. The west line runs through Mulford, Newark and Agnew. Our railhead Mulford is within the City of San Leandro, and industries at Mulford have a San Leandro mailing address. Cars going to industries in Mulford must be billed to Mulford, not San Leandro. Cars billed to San Leandro going to an industry located at Mulford often go to San Leandro resulting in delay of 24 hours or longer in spotting as cars must be moved back to Oakland thence to Mulford. This same situation also applies along our west line at railheads of Robert, Russell, Mt. Eden, Alvarado and Albrae. Cars must be billed to actual railhead point and not their respective mailing addresses.

Still continuing west on Davis St., tour will turn left on Doolittle Drive thence left at Williams St. thence right on Merced and again left at Marina. Some of the major industries to be viewed in Mulford following this route are as follows:

Tour will then continue east on Marina to Alvarado St., San Leandro, and right on Alvarado St. This brings us back to the east line and major industries in this area are:

Thence southeasterly bearing to left to Washington St. At Washington St. you will note General Foods, Maxwell House Divn, plant and Distribution Center. This facility is located at our railhead Estudillo and is served by both SPT and WP. Traffic during 1973 amounted to 3,180 cars.

Turn right on Washington back to Highway 17 and south on 17 to Hayward A Street off ramp. Turn left at A Street to the railroad cross-

ing and our Hayward Agency. Located at this point is the Hunt-Wesson Foods facility (6,875 cars in 1973) located on both A and B Streets, which includes, Hunt-Wesson Foods' canning and warehousing facility as well as Glass Container Corp. and United Can plant. Also located adjacent to our Hayward Agency is Select Union Foods (113 cars in 1973) major distributor of frozen citrus juices and frozen food products in the Northern California area.

From Hayward, tour group will return to Highway 17 and continue south moving through the Union City and Fremont areas to Thornton Ave., Newark. Turning right on Thornton and left off Thornton at Cherry St., continuing in a southerly direction on Cherry St., takes you through the Newark industrial area served exclusively by SPT--not open to reciprocal switching--which includes such major accounts as:

Thence left at Mowry to Highway 17 and south again to Warm Springs. Enroute to Warm Springs you will note our Albrae Industrial Park on the right which includes the following industries:

We again leave Highway 17 at Warren Ave. East thence left on Cato Road into the Warm Springs yard. This yard serves the General Motors Assembly Division at Warm Springs, which is located adjacent to the yard. Current production at this GM plant is the intermediate group A bodies: Chevrolets and Buick Century series as well as Chevrolet and GMC pick up trucks. You will note from list of top 30 firms, included herein, General Motors is the number one account in the Oakland District. Traffic during 1973 amounted to 33,874 cars.

Leaving Warm Springs, group will return to Highway 17 northbound to the Mowry Ave. off ramp for lunch at one of four restaurants located on Mowry adjacent to the highway. After lunch group will continue north on Highway 17 to Thornton Ave., Newark, across the Dumbarton Bridge to meet TR from San Francisco at SP Depot at Redwood City at 2 p.m.

ANTIOCH-MARTINEZ JOINT SWITCHING DISTRICT

By agreement dating from 1902, the SP and ATSF established a joint switching district whereby industries served by either line are considered jointly served.

For an approximate 20 mile area between Martinez and west city boundary of Antioch, each carrier switches on its own line, with contract per car charges for switching cars for the other carrier.

There are two points of interchange within the joint switching district--Pittsburg and Port Chicago. Rates to or from those points are applicable to industries in the joint area as outlined in Item 150 of SP Terminal Tariff 230-K (copy attached), with similar item in ATSF Terminal Tariff.

The agreement provides that when a new industry plans to locate on a given carrier's line, that carrier will so inform the other carrier and ask if the other carrier desires to participate in carrier cost of installation of switch, maintenance and such costs that are borne by carrier. If the other carrier elects to participate, the industry becomes jointly served.

Carload traffic to or from any such joint industry is open to our full system solicitation.

RICHMOND INNER HARBOR BELT RAILROAD RICHMOND. CALIFORNIA

The Richmond Inner Harbor Belt Railroad is jointly owned by S.P.T. Company and A.T.S.F. and is a local switching line.

By agreement, the line is switched for alternate 3-year periods by each of the owning roads. The A.T.S.F. is currently switching for period January 1, 1972, through December 31, 1974.

Reciprocal, with operating road performing switching for the other road. Operating and maintenance costs pro-rated between owning roads on basis of carloads handled for each line.

The Alameda Belt Line is a local switching line, owned jointly by A.T.S.F. Railway and Western Pacific Railroad, operating within the City of Alameda.

Formerly the ATSF and WP reached Alameda via own barges from Richmond and Oakland, respectively. Currently we bridge-switch all of the ATSF and WP traffic from our Oakland interchanges with those lines via our Fruitvale Avenue railroad bridge over the Oakland Estuary (Alameda is an island) and deliver to and receive from the Alameda Belt Line at our interchange with that line in Alameda. We receive a per car charge for this handling.
