All concerned must thoroughly familiarize themselves with the instructions and arrangements shown herein and take every precaution to insure safe operation of trains. All rules and instructions governing operation and protection of trains must be promptly and fully observed.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

Enginemen of football specials will, in case of trouble with their engines that will interfere with following trains, get into clear at the first available point so that delays to following service may be avoided if possible.

Enginemen are cautioned to use care in approaching terminals, particularly New Haven and Stamford, and proceed only as the way is known to be clear.

Conductors will, whenever practicable, station themselves on the rear end to personally superintend the flagging, and will see that their flagmen are equipped with necessary flags, torpedoes, fusees and lanterns for properly protecting trains.

Flagmen will be stationed at New Rochelle to protect all eastward passenger trains 8.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. Regular flagmen must know that their trains are protected.

Flagmen will be stationed at Stamford to protect all westward passenger trains between 4.00 p.m. and 11.00 p.m. This will relieve the flagmen on the westward passenger trains from 4.00 p.m. until 11.00 p.m. from protecting their train at Stamford. Regular flagmen must know that their trains are being protected.

Drawbridges must not be opened within fifteen (15) minutes in advance of any special or first-class train during the movement of football service, except in case of extreme emergency, and signalmen should be instructed accordingly.

Operators in block stations must use great care in plunging for the release of block, so that there will be no delays on account of signal failures, and must announce and clear all trains clearly and promptly.

Thorough inspection of electrical and interlocking plants will be made the day previous to the game, to prevent, if possible, any failures while the specials are on the road in either direction.

The working limits of work trains must be so restricted as to absolutely prevent interference with passenger trains during the movement of football service.

Freight trains between New Rochelle and New Haven in both directions will be kept in yards or on sidings while football specials are running between these points.

Freight and local passenger service between New Haven and Boston via Shore Line and Midland routes, also between New Haven and Springfield, must not be allowed to in any way interfere with movement of football service.

Signalmen will be stationed at interlocking points en route to render such assistance as necessary while specials are moving in either direction.

Regular collections will be made unless otherwise advised. Special forms of combined railroad and Pullman tickets will be issued for Specials P-1, B-1, B-2, B-3, B-4, B-5, B-6, and B-12.

Usual special car report Form 84 will be made in all cases covering parlor, sleeping or private cars. Also usual special train report Form 348 will be made covering special or extra train service. Collections of regular railroad and Pullman charge will be made from passengers in parlor or sleeping cars witt.out prescribed ticket.

Special trains for New Haven will bear the symbol on front of engine and each side of engine cab and where operated for return trip will carry same symbol.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS (Cont'd)

Signs designating stops of trains will be placed in windows of rains at New Haven.

Station signs for Pullman or private cars moving in special trains will be prepared and show number and name of car, selling number and name of party.

The additional and special service arranged herein, and such other additional service and cars as may be required, necessitate the economic use of passenger equipment of all classes. Chief Train Dispatchers should be promptly advised of passenger equipment on hand beyond actual requirements, or shortages thereof.

Conductors of all special and regular trains scheduled to arrive at New Haven between 9.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. will report by wire to Mr. E. E. Regan, Superintendent, New Haven, the number of passengers for New Haven, and similar report will be made of the number of passengers from New Haven on all special and regular trains leaving New Haven between 4.30 p.m. and 9.30 p.m.

Selected grade of coal to be furnished engines pulling special and regular trains handling football travel, also to engines assigned relief or emergency service. All old coal to be cleaned from tenders before given the selected fuel, that each engine in this service may have a uniform grade of coal throughout the movement.

Enginemen pulling special trains, also those handling emergency engines stationed en route, should keep close watch of their fuel and water that no unnecessary detention may occur for want of either.

Lighting features of all equipment assigned football service must be carefully inspected before leaving on its initial run to prevent lighting failures. Where acetylene or Pintsch lighted cars are used they must be given special attention and fully charged before going to assigned position for special use.

Extra Equipment Requirements Saturday, November 22

New York (Grand Central Terminal) will need 5 baggage cars and 213 coaches that should be moved into Mott Haven and the Grand Central Terminal under arrangements between the New Haven and New York Divisions and the Grand Central Terminal.

Stamford will need 7 coaches of the best wood-electric type as these cars will return with M-1 which may continue to the Grand Central Terminal.

Boston will need 3 baggage, 32 coaches, 2 diners and 75 Pullman cars that should be on hand the afternoon of November 21. (This does not include 10 coaches and 20 Pullmans to be furnished by the B. & A. R.R.)

Providence will need 4 coaches and 5 Pullman cars.

Springfield and Hartford will each need 8 coaches, which should be the best type of wooden equipment.

All coach equipment used for special trains from Grand Central Terminal, Providence and Boston should be steel cars; all Pullman equipment will be either all steel or steel underframe.
