ADDITIONAL SPEED RESTRICTIONS

Trains handling loaded oil tank cars between Rapid City and Pierre will not exceed 25 miles per hour.

The speed of a train moving over a cross-over, turn-out from main track to siding, or to diverging route at a junction, must not exceed 10 miles per hour, except as provided for in foregoing speed restrictions.

When Class J-JA-JS or Z engines are used on passenger trains, either single or double head, the maximum speed of such trains must not exceed speed for time freight trains.

Circus and Carnival trains on main line districts will not exceed 35 miles per hour on straight track and 25 miles per hour on curves. On branch lines will not exceed 25 miles per hour on straight track and 20 miles per hour on curves. Speed restrictions requiring less than the above speed must be observed.

Trains handling scale test car will not exceed 30 miles per hour on main sub-divisions, or 20 miles per hour on branch sub-divisions; such cars to be handled only upon specific instructions from Chief Dispatcher and placed in trains next to caboose and Rule 1073 observed.

Trains handling rotary snow plows, not in service, either pushing or trailing, will not exceed 18 miles per hour.

Rail motor cars, gas or oil-electric, when operated without a trailer car attached must come to a full stop at the home signal of an automatic interlocked railroad crossing, regardless of whether the signal is clear or not. If the signal indicates Proceed, the car may proceed after the stop is made, otherwise the release apparatus at the crossing must be operated in accordance with the second paragraph of General Rule 672.

At all junctions where stops are not required, trains must run at restricted speed. Special care must be taken by trains coming from or going to the branch line at such junctions and when weather conditions or other reasons cause the view to be obstructed, extra precaution must be taken by the trains on both lines.

A train moving in reverse direction in two or more track districts must not exceed ten (10) miles per hour over dangerous highway crossings, including crossings equipped with wig-wags or within the limits of any city.

Derrick cars must be hauled "trailing." Speed of wrecking outfits is restricted to 30 miles per hour between Waseca and Pierre via Mankato, Hawarden and Iroquois, James Valley Junction and Redfield, and is restricted to 25 miles per hour over balance of division.

Streamliner type trains and gas or diesel electric motor trains and engines must not be run over inundated tracks if the water is more than five inches above top of rail, and when operating through water speed must not exceed six miles per hour.

Unless otherwise instructed steam locomotive cranes in transit will not be handled at a speed in excess of 50 miles per hour and boom must be detached and cab properly blocked and secured. When these cranes are being operated or handled in trains with boom attached, speed must not exceed 15 miles per hour.

General Rules governing employes of the Operating Department dated December 1, 1929, and Supplement D dated June 15, 1935, in connection therewith, are issued in book form. Every employe whose duties are in any way prescribed by these rules must always have a copy of them on hand when on duty.

On the road, at stations, in yards and on industrial tracks, there are buildings, structures, station platform canopies, mail cranes, dividing or in between line fences which are located between tracks, bridge girders, and other obstructions which, owing to local conditions or requirements, do not give clearance to men on top of or side of cars or engines. Employes must familiarize themselves with these conditions in the districts in which they are employed and, where they exist, must not extend any part of their bodies out from engines or cars, or attempt to alight therefrom. New employes must exercise great care in this respect.

CROSSINGS, JUNCTIONS AND DRAW BRIDGES AT WHICH RULES 601A TO 672 AMENDED WILL BE OBSERVED

This inspection may be made at next adjacent station in either direction if, for any reason, it is more convenient to do so.

When not necessary to stop for other reason running inspection may be made by a member of the crew while train pulls by at slow speed.

Use of Engine

The use of sand is prohibited on all interlocking plants anywhere between the home signals, also prohibited between the fouling point and switch points on any turn-out connected with the main line in automatic block, automatic train control or centralized control districts, and must not be used on any spring switch between

the fouling point and the switch point. Sand is an insulator and its use on the rail may result in the improper functioning of signal or interlocking apparatus.

Mankato A siding 2200 feet in length is located south of and running parallel with the main track, just east of the east yard switch at Mankato which will be known as the "Quarry Siding" and will be used as a siding and lead to quarry industry only.

The train order signal located at the C. St. P. M. & O. and C. & N. W. passenger depot is used jointly by both lines. Before leaving Mankato all trains must obtain a Clearance Form A

In the district between the double crossover between the C. & N. W. and Omaha Main Tracks, 1200 feet east of Sibley Park crossing, about 5,500 feet west of Mankato passenger station, and the crossover at First Avenue about 1,000 feet west of the C. St. P. M. & O. crossing 1.75 miles east of Mankato passenger station, both of which are within yard limits, C. & N. W. trains and engines and C. St. P. M. & O. trains and engines may use the main tracks of either line upon receiving permission from the Yardmaster, and by ascertaining if overdue first class trains have arrived and by clearing first class trains not less than five minutes.

When trains of one line are given instructions by Yardmaster to use main track of other line, Yardmaster will be held responsible for knowing that first class trains that are due have arrived and departed.

All second class or inferior trains and extra trains must approach these crossovers at either end of the yard under full control expecting to find crossovers in use.

Sanborn

Dakota Division main track and yard tracks, within the yard limits at Sanborn, will be used jointly by the Dakota Division and the Nor. Iowa Division. Main track movements will be governed by General Rule 93 amended. The siding at Sanborn is the track immediately north of the main track, extending from the outer switch at the east end of the yard to the extreme west switch at the west end of yard. All Northern Iowa Division trains with the exception of first class trains, will approach Sanborn Yard at restricted speed expecting to find Dakota Division trains occupying Northern Iowa Division main track between crossover and depot at Sanborn.

St. Peter The junction switch to and from subdivision 1-f, located 1.6 miles east of the passenger station at New Ulm will be known as St. Peter Line Junction.

Gettysburg
The junction switch to and from subdivision 7-b, located 2800 feet west of the station at Redfield, will be known as Gettysburg Line Junction.

Marshall
Junction
The district between New Ulm and St. Peter Line Junction, between Marshall
and Marshall Junction, between Watertown and Watertown Junction, and between Redfield and Gettysburg Line Junction will be considered within yard
limits, and movements will be made in accordance with Rule 93 amended, excepting that first class trains will approach and move through these districts at restricted
speed. Nothing in these instructions is to be construed as permitting freight trains

or switch engines to delay first class trains.

The switch at Gettysburg Line Junction, west end of Redfield yard, will be set for Huron-Oakes main track.

Pierre
The track located south of, and running parallel to the main track, extending from the crossover just east of Washington Avenue to the crossover at the viaduct just east of the passenger station, will be considered the siding.

Evan The junction switch just west of Evan will be set for the Marshall-Evan Line.
The main track between this switch and Evan station will be considered within yard limits, and movements will be made in accordance with Rule 93 amended.

The junction switch just west of Wabasso will be set for the Marshall-Evan Line.
The main track between this switch and Wabasso station will be considered within yard limits and movements will be made in accordance with Rule 93 amended.

Box Elder The track serving the Bomber Base is an extension of Box Elder Yard tracks. All movements on this track will be governed accordingly.

Iroquois The east switch of the siding at Iroquois for trains arriving on Subdivision 5 will be the outer switch on Subdivision 5.

BLOCKING

Manual Block rules 302A to 373, govern between Waseca and Huron via Judson, 7:30 a. m. Block to 5:30 p. m.

Rule 362b A train moving under permissive train order or permissive Form C may follow the next preceding train not less than ten minutes.

Time Spacing Except as above Rules 380 to 382 govern, and trains will be spaced 10 minutes apart.

Trains and Manual block rules will not prohibit yard engines and trains from occupying the Yard Engines main track at the following stations:

Waseca Springfield Brookings
Janesville Sanborn Sioux Valley Jct.
Mankato Tracy Arlington
New Ulm Tyler Iroquois

providing that when so occupying such station grounds they clear the time of regular trains as provided by rules.

A clear block entitling train to pass to or through stations above named does not indicate that the main track is clear, but trains accepting block must approach and pass through such station under control.

Telephone Block West end Waseca yard in connection with Waseca. Stations

St. Peter Line Junction in connection with New Ulm.

Marshall in connection with Marshall Junction.

Trains arriving from Subdivision 7, before entering upon main track at Sioux Valley Junction will obtain the block to Brookings or Volga from the signalman at Brookings.

Trains to Subdivision 7 at Sioux Valley Junction, after clearing main line will report block clear to the signalman at Brookings.

Trains arriving from Subdivision 6 before entering upon main line at James Valley Junction will obtain the block to Huron from signalman at Huron.

Trains going to Subdivision 6 at James Valley Junction after clearing main line will report block clear to signalman at Huron.

Eastward Subdivision 3 trains required to register at James Valley Junction will obtain block at James Valley Junction from the signalman at Huron and Subdivision 3 trains required to register, will, after clearing block at James Valley Junction report block clear to signalman at Huron.

Trains to and from Subdivision 1f at New Ulm, to and from Subdivision 1a at Sanborn, and to and from the Nor. Iowa Division at Sanborn, will not require a clearance on block to enter Subdivision 1, but will operate according to time table and Book of Rules. Subdivision 1 trains in both directions must move at restricted speed.
