#### ADDITIONAL SPEED RESTRICTIONS

- The speed of a train or engine moving over a cross-over, turn-out from main track to siding, or to diverging route at a junction, must not exceed 10 miles per hour.
- Light engines, or engines with cabooses only, must not exceed 15 miles per hour over any street or highway crossing, in any city, town or village.
- 3. When Class JS, JA or Z engines are used on passenger trains, either single or double head, the maximum speed of such trains must not exceed time table maximum speed for freight trains.
- 4. Trains handling either U. S. Government scale test cars, our own scale test cars, or scale test cars of other railroads of this same type, will not exceed 30 miles per hour on subdivision 1, or 20 miles per hour on subdivisions 1a, 1b, 2, 2a, 3, 4 and 4a, such cars to be handled only upon specific instructions from chief dispatcher and placed in train next to caboose and Rule 1078 observed.
- 5. "Magor" air dump cars, series No. 11701 to 11765, odd numbers, or cars of a similar type may be handled only in switch, work train or way freight service and then only upon receipt of specific instructions for such handling from the Division Superintendent. This type of car, when handled under load, should not be moved at a speed greater than 20 miles per hour and when empty 25 miles per hour.

- 7. Diesel switch engines 1000, 1001, 1002, 1200 and those in 400 series must not be operated at speeds in excess of 25 miles per hour in either forward or backward movement.
- 8. Streamliner type trains and gas or diesel electric motor trains and engines must not run over inundated tracks if water is more than three inches above top of rail, and all trains will be governed by Rules 101, 101a and 713, and when operating through water must not exceed a speed of five miles per hour.
- 9. When locomotive cranes, derricks, and pile drivers are moved in regular freight trains, the boom of locomotive cranes and derricks must be detached. The cotter key or nut at the bottom of the center pin in the trailing truck of all equipment must be removed when truck is so equipped. The speed of trains handling such cranes must be restricted to 25 M.P.H., or 15 M.P.H. less than the stipulated freight train speed, whichever is greater. They should be handled next to caboose, and when it can be conveniently arranged, moved with boom trailing.
- 10. The speed of all freight trains when making backup movements must be restricted to ten (10) miles per hour.
- Trains handling lumber loaded in open top cars must not exceed 30 miles per hour at any point.
- 12. The speed of trains handling Rotary Snow Plows, not in service, will be restricted to 18 miles per hour. Where track conditions will not justify speed of 18 miles per hour the speed must be further reduced to meet existing conditions. When they are handled ahead of engine not in service the wheel of the Rotary should be kept revolving slowly.
- 13. Unless otherwise instructed steam wrecking outfits must not exceed a speed of 30 miles per hour between Belle Plaine and Sanborn, 25 miles per hour between Jewell and Eagle Grove, 20 miles per hour between Tama and Jewell and 15 miles per hour on other subdivisions.

#### WEBSTER CITY

14. All trains must not exceed six miles per hour over all street crossings.

#### FAIRMONT

15. All second, third class and extra trains approaching Fairmont from either direction must do so at restricted speed, expecting to find C. St. P. M. & O. engines occupying main track or switching at either end of the C. & N. W. yards, and expecting to find Siding occupied.

#### BLUE EARTH

16. All second, third class and extra trains approaching Blue Earth from either direction, must do so at restricted speed, expecting to find C. St. P. M. & O. engines switching at either end of C. & N. W. yard.

17. Class J, JS or JA engines must not exceed 5 miles per hour when turning on wye.

All members of train, yard and engine crews must consult bulletin boards and familiarize themselves with instructions contained in these General Orders and Special Orders. Conductors, engineers and yard foremen must receipt for all General Orders in a book provided for that purpose at each bulletin board location, entering in this book date and time that order is read as well as signature.

#### SPECIAL RULES

On the road, at stations, in yards and on industrial tracks, there are buildings, structures, station platform canopies, mail cranes, dividing or between line fences which are located between tracks, bridge girders, and other obstructions which, owing to local conditions or requirements, do not give clearance to men on top of or side of cars or engines. Employes must familiarize themselves with these conditions in the districts in which they are employed and, where they exist, must not extend any part of their bodies out from engines or cars or attempt to alight therefrom. New employes must exercise great care in this respect.

#### CLEARANCE FORM A

4. Trains will not be required to obtain Clearance Form A, in compliance with Rule 83c at initial division or subdivision station when same is a noncommunicating station or the office is closed.

#### TAMA

5. Between Tama Tower and Tama Freight Yard trains will be governed by the time table of the Iowa Division (East District).

#### **JEWELL**

6. Tracks at Jewell within yard limits will be used jointly by Northern Iowa, Iowa East and Sioux City District Trains. Main track movements will be made in accordance with Rule 93.

#### SPECIAL RULES—Continued

#### SANBORN

7. Dakota Division main track and yard tracks, within yard limits at Sandborn, will be used jointly by the Dakota Division and Iowa Division (Northern Iowa District). Main track movements will be made in accordance with Rule 93.

#### ORDINANCE SOUNDING WHISTLE

8. Railroad Compaines shall not cause or allow the whistle of any locomotive engine to be sounded within the city limits of Mason City and Belle Plaine except such as may be absolutely necessary to prevent injury to persons or damage to property.

#### **EAGLE GROVE**

9. The normal position of the main track switch located 300 feet East of Highway No. 60 entering the west yard will be for the yard.

#### EAGLE GROVE

10. The normal position of North wve switch on subdivision No. 4 is for the wye.

#### BURT

11. The normal position of junction switch will be for subdivision 4a (Elmore line).

#### TIME SPACING RULE 91

12. Rules 380 to 382, inclusive, govern. Trains will be spaced ten minutes apart.

#### PARKERSBURG

13. Class J. JS and JA engines must not operate beyond frog of Illinois Central interchange track.

#### **PARKERSBURG**

14. Eastward freight trains stopping west of bridge 162, will stop west of private crossing to eliminate continuous operation of crossing protection while getting water or doing work.

#### USE OF SAND

15. The use of sand is prohibited on all interlockings anywhere between the home signals; also prohibited between the fouling point and switch points on any turn-out connected with the main track in automatic block, automatic train control or centralized control districts, and must not be used on any spring switch between the fouling point and the switch point. Sand is an insulator and its use on the rail may result in the improper functioning of signal or interlocking apparatus.

#### SPRINKLING HOGS—RULE 131a

16. Conductors will see that Rule 731a is observed and that record is kept on wheel report showing station at which each car of hogs is sprinkled, and condition of hogs when taken and left. Hog sprinkling devices are located at Fox Lake, Blue Earth, Bricelyn, Lake Mills, Dougherty, Parkersburg, Dike, Traer, Deep River, Hawarden, Alton, Sioux Rapids, Bradgate, Eagle Grove, Jewell, Gifford, Tama, Ringsted and Burt.

#### RED REAR OSCILLATING LIGHT

17. This is an emergency light, and must not be displayed while train is moving under normal speed and circumstances. When a train equipped with red rear oscillating light is moving under circumstances in which it may be overtaken by another train, or comes to a stop, the flagman must see that the light is in operation. See Operating Rule 18.

#### PROTECTION ON BRANCH LINES

18. On Subdivisions 1, 1a, 2, 2a, 3, 4 and 4a second and third class trains, extra trains and engines, may occupy the main track at stations between station mile boards, protecting against scheduled trains only, and extra trains must approach all stations prepared to stop, expecting to find the main track occupied between the station mile boards.

When possible, trains will be notified of following extra trains by train order in the following form: "After......M, protect against Extra..... (East or West).

Trains receiving this order, will, after the specified time protect as prescribed by Rule 99.

Where yard limit signs are indicated Rule 93 will govern.
