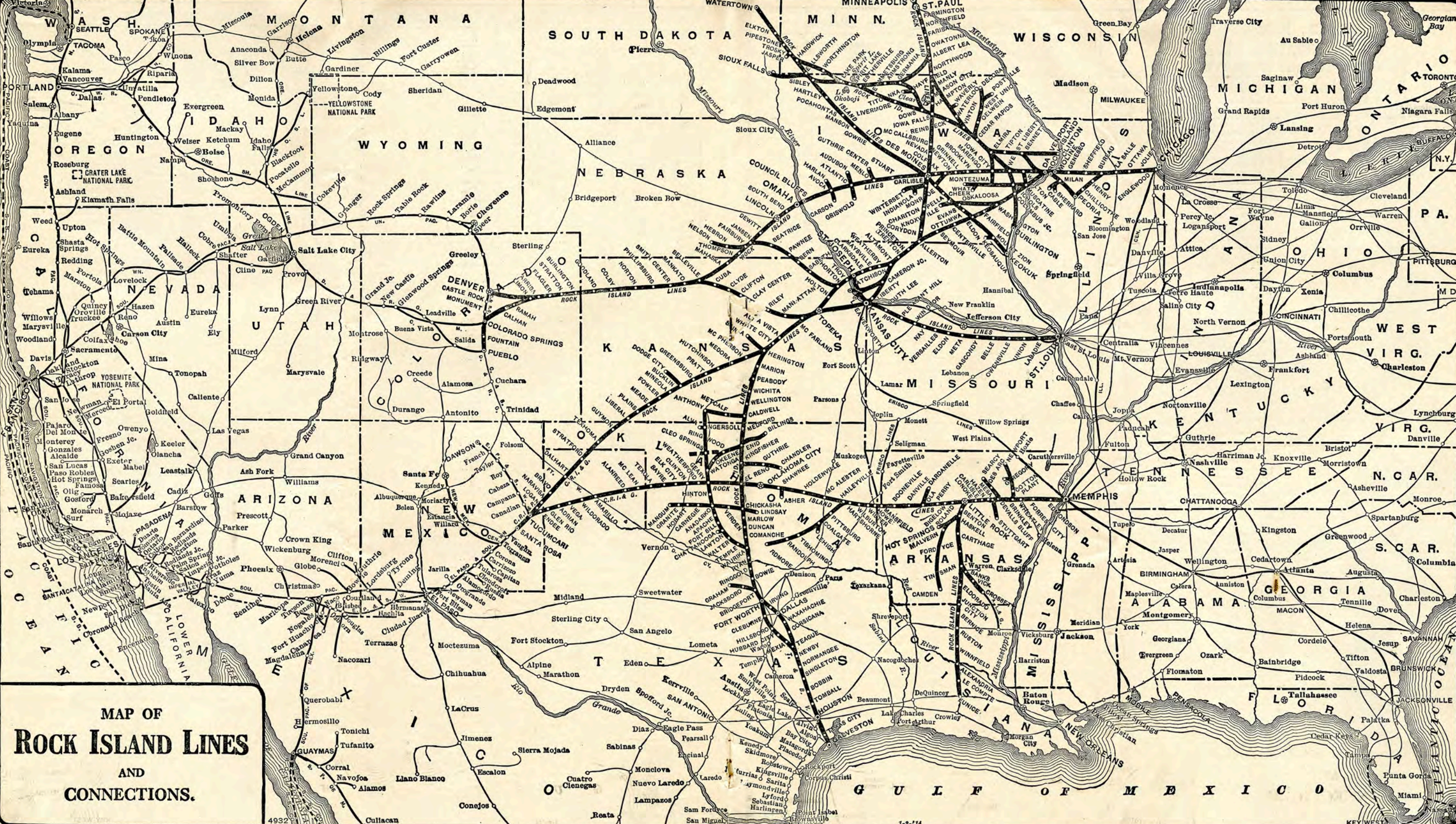

GENERAL INFORMATION.

STANDARD OF TIME—Rock Island Lines trains east of Phillipsburg, Kan., and Tucumcari, N. M., are run by Central Time; west of Phillipsburg, Kan., and Tucumcari, N. M., by Mountain Time.

MILEAGE—The mileage stated in time tables is shown in full figures for the information of passengers only and is not to be used in computing fares.

REDEMPTION OF TICKETS—The unused portion of tickets of C. R. I. & P. issue having any value will be redeemed upon presentation, by letter or in person, to Mr. L. M. Allen, Passenger Traffic Manager, Rock Island Lines, seventh floor La Salle station, Chicago, Ill. The unused portion of tickets issued by other roads mentioned herein should be sent to General Passenger Agent of issuing road.

SECOND-CLASS TICKETS are accepted for passage in coaches and chair cars. Upon payment of berth rate, they are accepted in tourist sleeping cars and also in standard sleepers between certain points.

RESTRICTIONS, "GOLDEN STATE LIMITED"—Homeseekers' Excursion tickets to points east of Dalhart, Tex. on tickets marked "Special" or "Charity" or "Employment" tickets to El Paso and east on any form of transportation endorsed "not good on Golden State Limited" will not be honored. Second class tickets may be honored only in tourist sleeping cars on these trains.

LIMIT OF TICKETS—Through first-class, second-class and round-trip tickets are closely limited as to time. With the desire to accommodate our patrons so far as possible such tickets, when presented by passengers on our line prior to midnight of date of expiration of limit, will be honored for continuous passage to destination on our line.

MILEAGE TICKETS are sold under the following conditions:
2,000-mile individual tickets (good in territory east of the Missouri River) will be sold at rate of \$40.00, limited to one year from date of sale, are interchangeable and good for passage over other lines indicated on the book.

2,000-mile individual tickets (good in territory west of the Missouri River) will be sold at rate of \$40.00, limited to one year from date of sale, are interchangeable and good for passage over other lines indicated on the book.

1,000-mile bearer tickets at rate of \$20.00, limited to one year from date of sale, good for transportation in territory west of the Missouri River. These tickets will be honored on trains for bearer, for the passage of more than one person on the same train.

1,000-mile bearer tickets endorsed "Good only in the State of Nebraska" will be sold at rate of \$20.00 each and limited to two years from date of sale.

1,000-mile individual tickets at rate of \$25.00, limited to one year from date of sale, good for transportation in territory west of the Missouri River, also on St. Louis-Kansas City Line.

These tickets can be purchased at all principal coupon ticket offices in the territory in which they are honored.

CHILDREN who are not five years old are carried free when accompanied by parents or guardians. Those who have reached or passed their fifth birthday, and are under twelve years of age require a half ticket. Those who have reached or passed their twelfth birthday require a full ticket. Conductors are not allowed to vary from this rule.

COUPON (OR INTERLINE) TICKETS, that is, tickets from a station on one road to a station on another road, are sold at stations prefixed by "x" on pages 4 and 5.

Money is frequently saved by purchasing coupon tickets. Intending passengers at non-coupon stations can arrange for coupon tickets and through baggage checks by giving agent sufficient advance notice to enable him to order them.

STOP-OVERS not to exceed final limit of ticket, will be allowed at the following points on all round-trip tickets reading via the C. R. I. & P. Ry. from or through points named: Benton, Ark., Burlington, Iowa, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Chicago, Ill., Colfax, Iowa, Colorado Springs, Colo., Council Bluffs, Iowa, Davenport, Iowa, Denver, Colo., Des Moines, Iowa, El Paso, Kansas City, Mo., Lincoln, Neb., Little Rock, Ark., Memphis, Tenn., Minneapolis, Minn., Moline, Ill., Oelwein, Iowa, Omaha, Neb., Pueblo, Colo., Rock Island, Ill., St. Joseph, Mo., St. Louis, Mo., St. Paul, Minn., Topeka, Kan., Wichita, Kan., and Mason City, Iowa.

On all tickets (first or second-class, one-way or round-trip), reading to or from points in Arizona, Nevada, California, Mexico, Oregon, Washington, Idaho and British Columbia, also on "Around the World" tickets, and also on "Coin Trans-Pacific" tickets issued at a point in Europe to a point in the Orient, Australasia, etc., or vice versa, stop-overs will be allowed at any time within authorized transit limit. Such stop-overs may be obtained by special permit from representative or on application to conductors.

On all one-way or round trip tickets (first or second-class) reading between Missouri River Gateways (Council Bluffs, Omaha, St. Joseph, Atchison, Leavenworth and Kansas City) or a point east thereof, and Denver, Colorado Springs, or Pueblo or a point west thereof, stop-overs will be allowed at all points on these lines within authorized transit limits.

On all first or second-class tickets (one-way or round-trip) reading to or from all territory, except as specified above, stop-overs will be allowed at or west of Missouri River points (Council Bluffs, Omaha, St. Joseph, Atchison, Leavenworth, Kansas City, and Memphis, Tenn.) within authorized transit limits.

All stop-overs authorized under these rules will be granted only within the limit, and under no circumstances will any extension of transit or final limit be made in order to allow stop-overs.

EXCEPTION—On round-trip "Winter tourist", "Summer Tourist" and "All-Year Tourist" tickets reading via the C. R. I. & P. Ry. stop-overs will be permitted at all stations, both going and returning, within final limit of ticket, upon application to conductors.

CHARGES FOR DRAWING-ROOMS AND COMPARTMENTS—A minimum of one and one-half adult passage tickets will be required for the exclusive use of a compartment and two adult passage tickets will be required for the exclusive use of a drawing-room in all standard sleeping cars operated between all points on the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Ry., also in all through standard sleeping cars operated between all points on the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Ry. and points on or via other lines.

When members of the same family or party occupy one or more drawing rooms or compartments, extra tickets will not be required if the total number of tickets presented for the entire party is equivalent to two whole tickets for each drawing room and one and one-half ticket for each compartment.

No allowance will be made for tickets held by members of the same family or party who may occupy berth space in the same car or train.

STOP-OVERS ON PULLMAN TICKETS—Through Pullman sleeping car tickets (standard and tourist) will permit of stop-overs limited to ten days at any of the following points, providing positive reservation of accommodations to and from the point of stop-over has been made at each stop station. Take conductors' or ticket agent's receipt for amount paid. When you reach your destination write to the General Passenger Agent of the road of which you bought your ticket, enclose receipt and explain the circumstances. If your ticket is found and returned unused the company will refund your money.

LOST TICKETS—If you lose your ticket you are out of pocket the value thereof. The railroad company is under no obligation to give you another in its place nor to allow you to ride free. Give notice of your loss to the conductor. Pay your fare to him or purchase another ticket at the next station. Take conductor's or ticket agent's receipt for amount paid. When you reach your destination write to the General Passenger Agent of the road of which you bought your ticket, enclose receipt and explain the circumstances. If your ticket is found and returned unused the company will refund your money.

LOST ARTICLES are in charge of General Baggage Agent at Chicago; passengers who have lost articles on trains or at stations will please communicate with him direct or through their nearest ticket agent.

A MIXED TRAIN is a train composed of both freight cars and passenger cars, and does both freight and passenger work.

A FREIGHT TRAIN carries a caboose only for the accommodation of passengers. The Railroad Company will not be responsible for any injury to or death of any passenger traveling on freight trains.

EXPRESS LETTER is provided on all trains having baggage cars.

THE AMERICAN EXPRESS CO. operates over all parts of Rock Island Lines.

BAGGAGE—150 pounds of baggage will be carried free on each whole ticket and 75 pounds on each half ticket.

In Nebraska free allowance may be 200 pounds on each full ticket and 100 pounds on each half ticket, when starting point and destination of ticket are both within the state.

Clergymen, etc., presenting half tickets together with half-fare permits, are allowed 150 pounds of baggage free.

Passengers holding tickets for trans-Pacific points (China, Japan, etc.) will be allowed 350 pounds of baggage on each whole ticket, and 175 pounds on each half ticket.

Baggage in excess of the above allowances will be charged for at rates published in current Tariffs of the first-class limited ticket rate per 100 pounds.

Any one piece of baggage the greatest dimension of which exceeds seventy-two (72) inches (except whips in cases and public entertainment paraphernalia, etc.) or weighing over 250 pounds (except immigrant baggage) will not be checked, but must be sent by express or freight.

Baggage for Mexican points checked beyond the Mexican border, will be inspected by the Mexican customs. While Mexican roads allow 150 pounds of baggage free on tickets bought in the United States, only 110 pounds will be carried free on first-class, and 70 pounds on second-class tickets between local stations in Mexico.

Baggage for Alaska or trans-Pacific points will not be checked beyond point where land journey ends.

Time and space will permit of the handling of a limited amount of baggage only upon limited trains Nos. 7 and 8, and Nos. 3 and 4. Passengers using said trains are hereby notified that the Company does not undertake to carry their baggage upon said trains, and reserves the right to carry the same on trains following.

Baggage must be delivered at stations in sufficient time before train is due to leave to weigh, check and make necessary collections, if any; otherwise, it will be forwarded on the following train under C. O. D. for any excess or other charges.

For the passenger's own protection all baggage to be checked should bear owner's name and address in a substantial and legible manner, as the absence of these particulars is cause for refusal to check, and sometimes results in loss of baggage, with the consequent annoyance, inconvenience and expense to the owner as well as to the carrier.

STORAGE OF BAGGAGE—The following rules apply: (a) Storage will be charged on each piece of baggage, either inbound or outbound, checked or not checked, remaining at the station over twenty-four (24) hours, as follows: The first twenty-four (24) hours free; the second 24 hours or fraction thereof, 25 cents; for each succeeding 24 hours or fraction thereof, 10 cents, except that baggage will be held free when received at any hour Saturday and cleared before same hour Monday; or when received at any hour Sunday and cleared before midnight Monday. If not claimed within the time specified, storage will commence 24 hours after receipt of the baggage. Legal holidays will be treated same as Sundays, but no deduction will be made for Sundays or legal holidays after storage has begun. (b) Storage within the state of Arkansas will be the same as above for all baggage exceeding one hundred and fifty (150) pounds in weight to each passenger. All baggage not exceeding one hundred and fifty (150) pounds in weight to each passenger may remain on hand free of storage for forty-eight (48) hours. Baggage remaining unclaimed over forty-eight (48) hours, storage will be charged at rate of five (5) cents per piece for each day or fraction thereof. (c) Storage within the state of Louisiana will be the same as shown in paragraph (a), except that baggage may remain on hand free of storage charges for forty-eight (48) hours.

Baggage checked to a station where there is no agent should be claimed of the train baggage check at the arrival of the train, and the duplicate check held by passenger surrendered to him. Otherwise the baggage will be carried beyond to the first station having an agent. Stations having no agent are designated by "n" immediately following the station name in the body of the time tables.

This Company will not be responsible for loss or damage in any sum over \$100.00 for legal baggage, except when greater value is declared and charge made therefor in accordance with tariff requirements.

To avoid storage charges, claim your baggage immediately upon arrival at destination. Passengers should take memorandum of check number to avoid confusion in delivery of baggage, in case duplicate check is lost.

BAGGAGE ON MOTOR CARS—In order to provide greater facilities for transportation of passengers, this Company has placed motor cars in service between certain points. Owing to limited space provided for baggage, the Company does not guarantee transportation of baggage in these cars and will not be responsible for any delay by reason of failure to handle baggage therein.

BAGGAGE CHECKED FROM RESIDENCE—In addition to the arrangements for checking baggage from residence to destination which exists at many points on Rock Island Lines, passengers may check baggage from residence at starting point, to residence or hotel, at destination, between the cities of Chicago, Kansas City, St. Louis, Denver, Colorado Springs and Omaha. A reasonable charge per piece is made at each end for this service.

FOR DOGS—Dogs not exceeding twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) in value, when not intended for exhibition, bench show or field trials, if provided with properly fitting collar and strong chain, and muzzled or in crates, and if accompanied by owner or caretaker, will be checked and transported in baggage cars and charge made at regular excess baggage rates for gross weight, no charge to check bags (two cents) (25) cents. The minimum charge for each dog on chain or for each crate containing one or more dogs, will be the regular charge for one hundred (100) lbs. of excess baggage between the same points, no charge to be less than twenty-five (25) cents, except that dogs will not be checked beyond junction points where wagon transfer is required.

EXCEPTION—Locally in Texas on the C. R. I. & G. Ry., no more than two dogs will be carried for any one person and a charge of 25 cents assessed for each dog for any distance under 50 miles, and one-half cent per mile for distances over 50 miles, not to exceed \$1.00 per dog for the trip to destination, or junction point with connecting line.

BICYCLES, TRICYCLES, BABY CARS AND GO-CARTS are checked at rate charge for 50 pounds excess baggage, with minimum of 25 cents, unless that weight is exceeded, when actual weight will be charged for; except that bicycles and tricycles are checked without charge locally within the states of Colorado and Arkansas.

FOR CORPSE—The rate for the transportation of a corpse, regardless of the age of the deceased, will be one regular lowest first-class adult fare, with minimum fare of \$1.00, when accompanied by an adult in charge who must hold transportation. 150 pounds of baggage is allowed on each corpse ticket.

An adult corpse can be forwarded by express at double the regular first-class ticket rate, and that of a child under twelve years of age at one regular first-class ticket rate. When a corpse is shipped by express, no attendant or accompanying person is necessary. No ticket will be issued for a corpse through New York City.

CAUTION—Should any difference arise between yourself and the conductor, pay latter's claim, take receipt for the amount, and refer the matter to the General Passenger Agent for adjustment.

TRAINS usually run on time, in accordance with time tables given herein, but the Company will not be responsible for consequences arising from delays, or from errors in the printed schedules.

OPTIONAL ROUTES—Between certain stations on the C. R. I. & P., passengers will be allowed to go via one of two or more routes at their option. The principal routes are, mentioned below and will be granted on all classes of tickets, whether of C. R. I. & P. issue or other lines' issue, and in either direction. This will apply on tickets sold at short-line rates.
