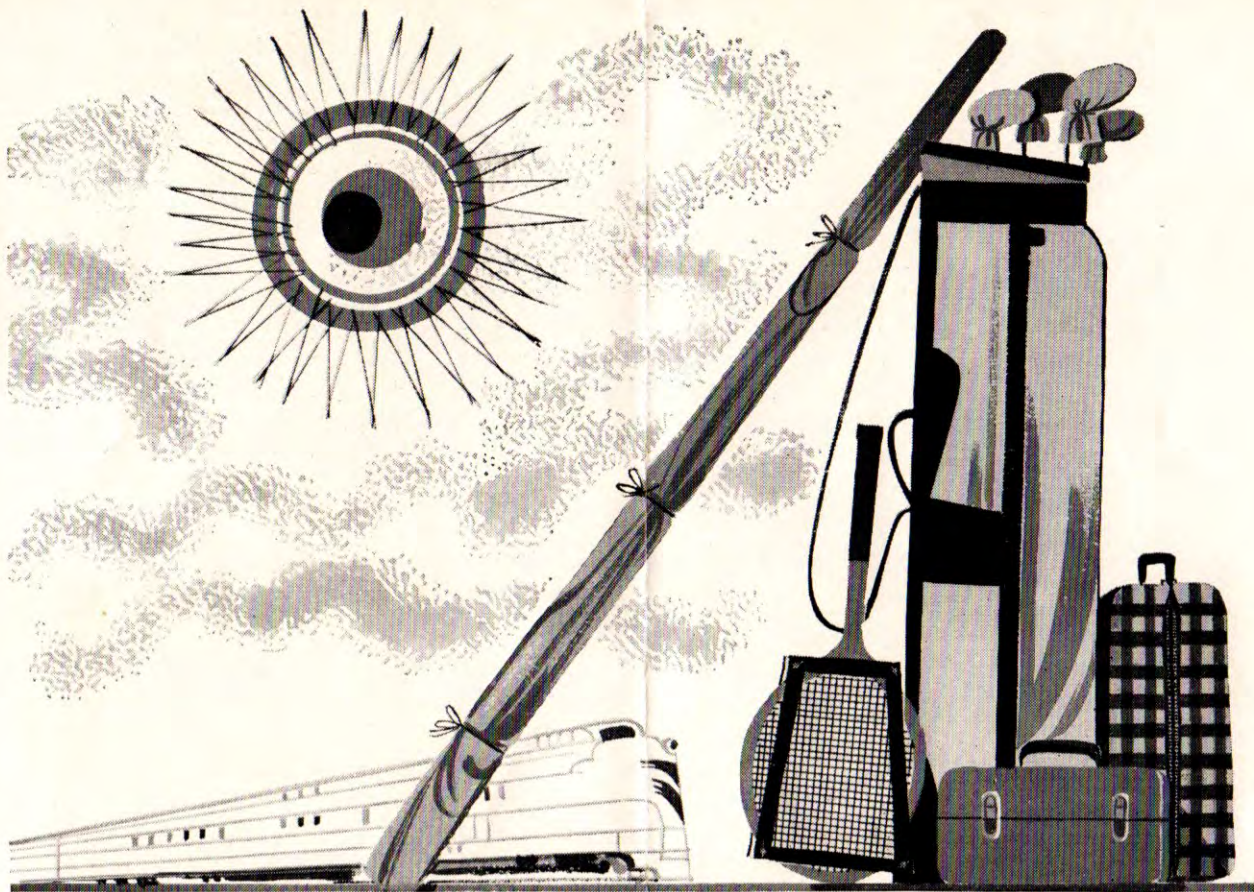

## Helpful Suggestions for Reading this Time Table

We have tried to make this time table easier to read. Here are a few suggestions.

The alphabetical Station Index, page 5, furnishes a convenient reference to the Table Number for individual route schedules. Locate your point of destination in this index, then turn to the Table Number opposite the station in which you are interested. The Table Numbers are featured prominently at the top of each schedule. These should not be confused with the page numbers that appear at the bottom of each page.

In the case of the schedules for Chicago to St. Louis and St. Louis to Chicago, the figures read down. Where station columns appear in the center of the table, the schedule figures on the left should be read down (from top to bottom) while the schedule figures on the right of the station column should be read up (from bottom to top).

Time from 12:01 A.M. to 12:00 Noon, inclusive, is shown in LIGHT face type. Time from 12:01 P.M. to 12:00 Midnight, inclusive, is shown in DARK face type.

Please be sure to note various symbols (such as A, C, T) in schedule columns as they indicate exceptions. These are usually explained under reference notes on the same page as the schedule.

The centerspread, pages 10 and 11, is a map of the Gulf, Mobile and Ohio system, showing territory covered by our railroad. Reference to this map may prove helpful in planning your trip or shipment of freight.

The Gulf Transport Company schedules appear on pages 13, 15. This is a wholly-owned bus subsidiary of the Gulf, Mobile and Ohio System.

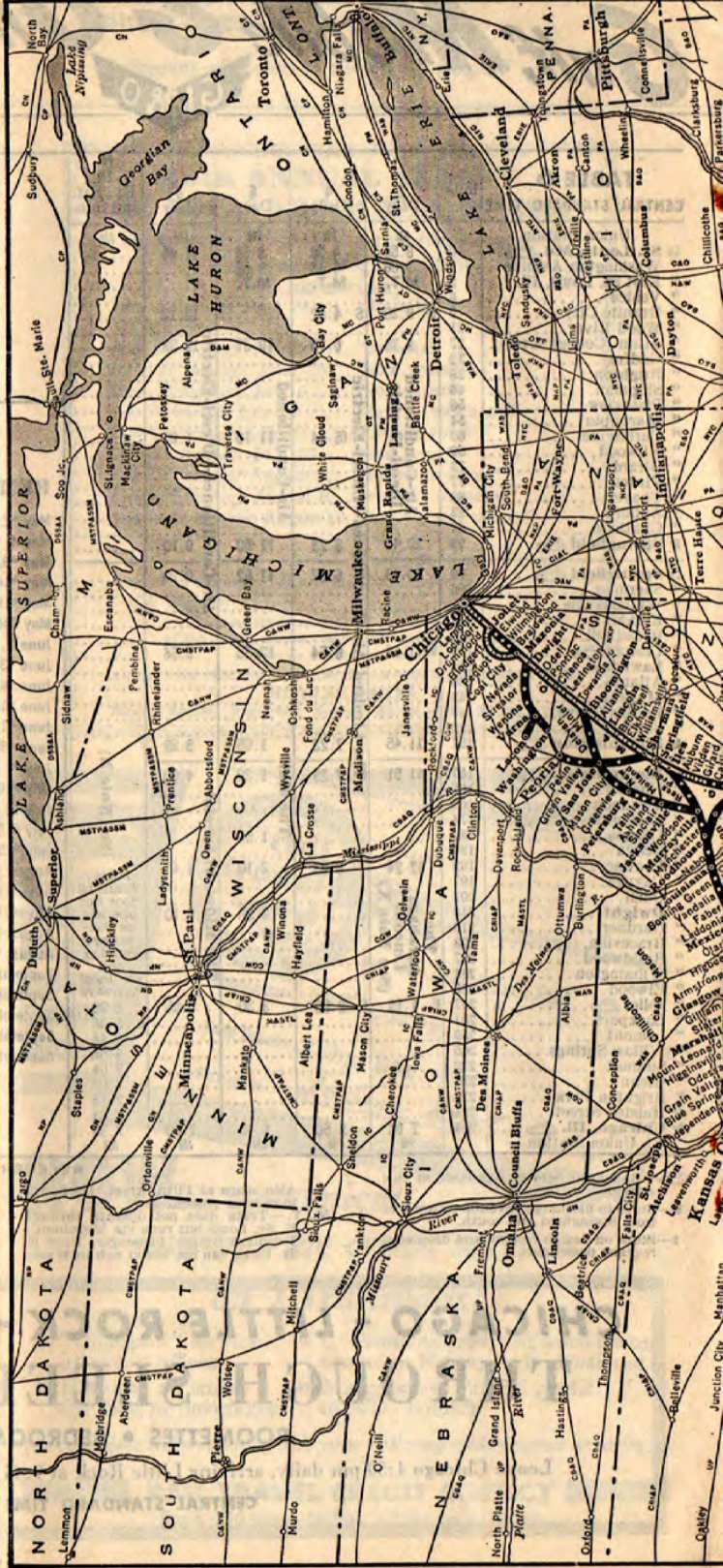

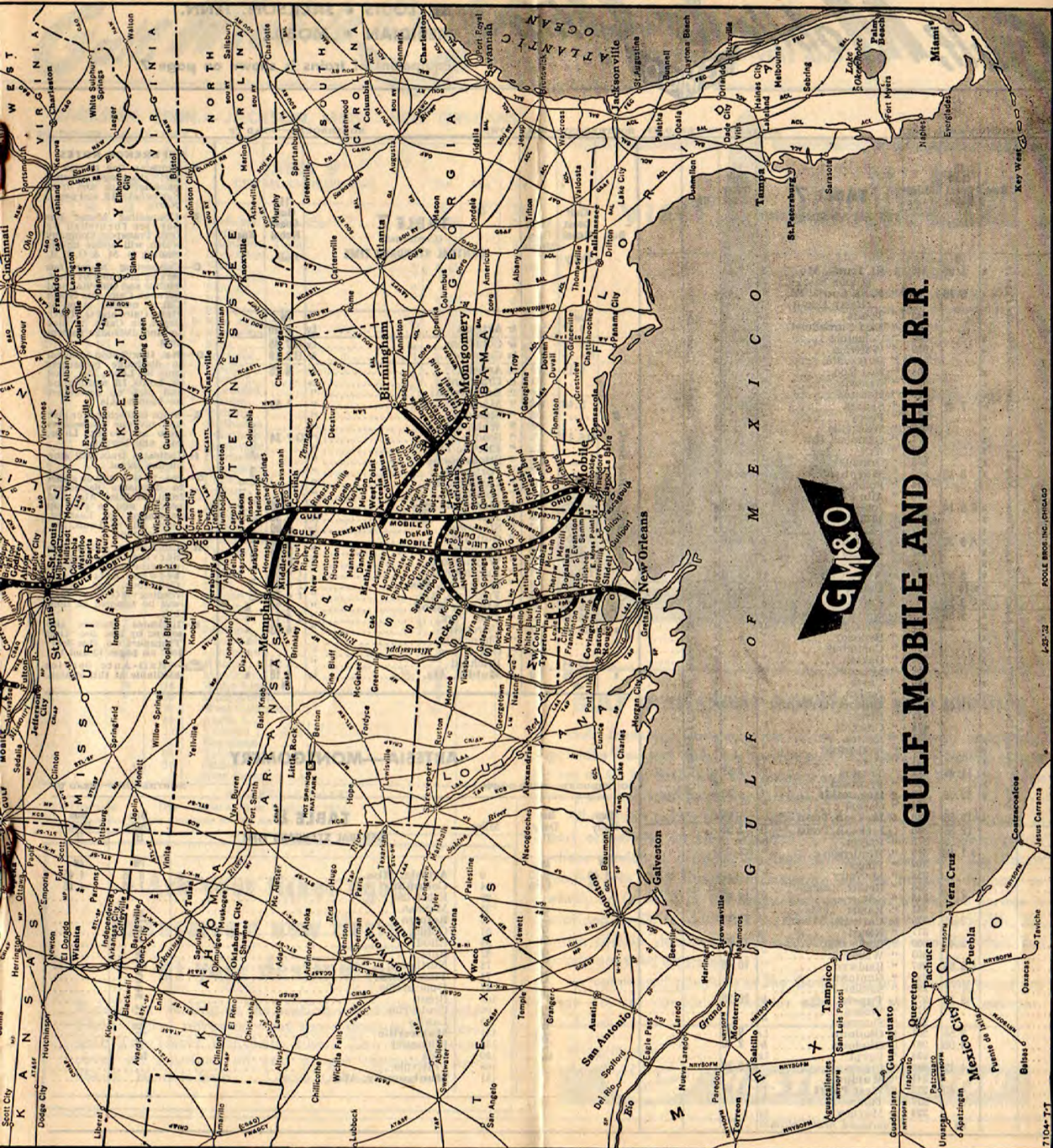

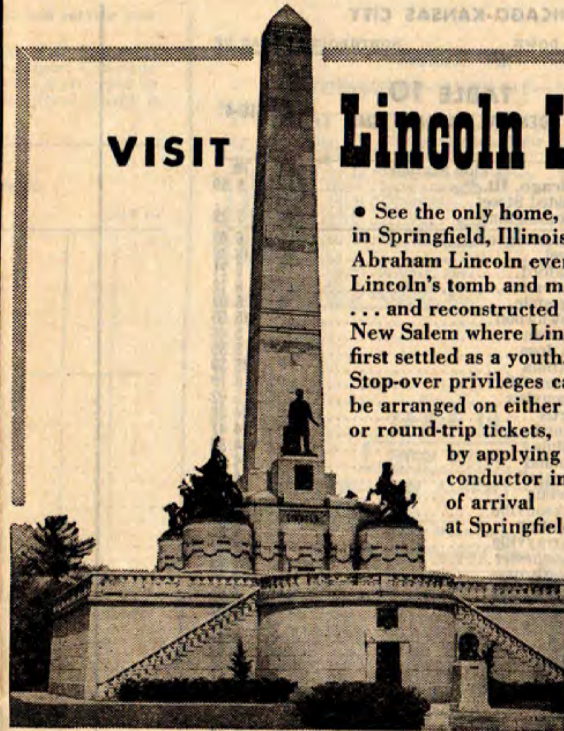

(except via L&N R.R.) with coupon reading from New Orleans, La. via Illinois Central R.R., or Missouri Pacific R.R., to St. Louis, Mo., also Southern Railway Meridian, Miss., and Gulf, Mobile and Ohio R.R. to St. Louis, Mo., or points beyond, will, without additional charge, be exchanged by Gulf, Mobile and Ohio R.R. at Mobile, Ala., for tickets reading via Gulf, Mobile and Ohio R.R. from Mobile, Ala. to St. Louis, Mo., or points beyond.

Return portion of round trip tickets sold at stations St. Louis, Mo., Chicago, Ill., and contiguous territory, as provided in tariffs, reading to Mobile, Ala., via Gulf, Mobile and Ohio R.R., will, upon additional payment of \$2.70 be exchanged by Illinois Central R.R., Missouri Pacific R.R., at New Orleans, La. for tickets reading to St. Louis, Mo. Also at New Orleans, La. by Southern Railway for tickets reading via Meridian, Miss. and Gulf, Mobile and Ohio R.R. to St. Louis, Mo., or points beyond.

The going portion may be exchanged via Gulf, Mobile and Ohio R.R. to Mobile, Ala., without additional charge.

Passengers to make own arrangements for transportation from New Orleans to Mobile, and from Mobile to New Orleans as the case may be.

**SALE OF SEATS:**

Seats in sleeping cars will be sold from stations passed after a reasonable hour in the morning, where such sales will not discommode Berth passengers, but will not be sold to stations passed after 10:30 p.m. or before a reasonable time in the morning, except by a special order, or except where car is due to arrive at terminus not later than midnight, or where there are unsold drawing rooms, or other types of accommo-

dations in which seat passengers could be accommodated without discommode Berth passengers. This rule will not apply to observation, lounge, composite or club cars of this Company, in which seats may be sold during the night when such sales do not inconvenience sleeping car passengers. SEAT PASSENGERS WILL NOT BE LOCATED IN SPACE OF BERTH OR SECTION PASSENGERS.



### TRAIN INFORMATION

All Gulf, Mobile and Ohio trains operate on Central Standard Time. These timetables show when trains are scheduled to arrive and depart from stations—and stops are made only at stations where time is given or as indicated by special or conditional stops as shown in notes. While the company makes every effort to maintain schedules, it cannot guarantee the arrival and departure at times shown nor assume responsibility for delays or consequences arising therefrom. Likewise, the schedules and equipment shown in this timetable are subject to change without notice.

Our passenger and ticket agents will be pleased to confirm time of departures and arrivals and provide other train service information.

### INFORMATION ON TICKETS AND FARES

Conductors are required to issue receipts for fares paid on trains.

Passengers desiring to purchase round trip tickets at stations where no agent is on duty may procure one-way cash receipt from conductor on train. Upon arrival destination the agent will exchange receipt for return ticket at benefit of reduced round trip fares.

Children under 5 years of age transported free, when accompanied by parent or guardian; 5 years of age and under 12, one-half fare; 12 years of age or over, full fare (see NOTE). Exception—children under half-fare age occupying seat in parlor car must pay one-half fare plus the usual parlor car seat fare.

**NOTE:** Children under twelve (12) years of age who are not mature enough to care for themselves when traveling must not be ticketed unless accompanied by parent or guardian.

**Adjustments of Fares**—Should any misunderstanding arise with conductors or agents as to the proper fare or ticket privileges, please pay fare requested, take receipt and communicate with Passenger Traffic Manager, Room 800, 721 Olive St., St. Louis 1, Mo.

**Stop-Overs**—In general stop-over privileges are permitted at all points to holders of one-way and round-trip tickets upon application to conductor within final time limits. (Exception—certain excursion tickets.)

**Time Limit on use of Ticket**—One-way tickets are limited to 30 days from date of sale and must be used within that limit unless otherwise stated. Round trip tickets—final return limit six months unless otherwise stated.

We recommend round trip tickets as you save both time and money in their purchase

**Honoring Tickets to Non-Stop Stations**—Passengers holding tickets to stations at which through train does not stop are required to transfer at some intermediate point (usually the last regular stopping point short of destination) and to use first following local train scheduled to stop at destination.

### GULF TRANSPORT COMPANY BUS SERVICE

Gulf Transport Company, the Gulf, Mobile and Ohio System's highway subsidiary, provides frequent daily bus service over highways paralleling certain lines of the Gulf, Mobile and Ohio Railroad. See page 15 of this folder for schedules and ticket interchange options.

### BAGGAGE INFORMATION

Please mark or tag each piece of your baggage with your name and address and place your name and permanent address inside each piece whether the baggage is checked or carried with you on the train. We recommend the checking of heavy and large size hand luggage in regular baggage service.

Passengers may check without additional charge up to 150 pounds on each ticket, 75 pounds on each half ticket. Above these amounts excess will be charged with a maximum of 300 pounds or 72 inches in greatest dimension. Above these limits shipments qualify not as baggage but as express or freight. Passengers are requested to declare the actual value of baggage at time of checking. The maximum baggage tariff liability per adult ticket is \$100.00, per each half-fare ticket \$50.00. If the value on baggage exceeds this allowance, a charge of 25 cents for each additional \$100.00 or fraction thereof is made with a limit of excess for one passenger of \$2,500.00.

Every effort is made to forward baggage on same train with passenger, but obviously because of time and baggage space limitations on certain trains this cannot be guaranteed.

**Special Delivery**—Passengers desiring to have their baggage delivered promptly at hotel or residence at destination may obtain special delivery checks from agent at starting point by paying the transfer company's charges prescribed in the baggage tariff. Authorized transfer companies will call for and check baggage from hotels and residences in principal cities.

**Dogs and Pets**—Dogs and other household pets are transported in baggage cars subject to tariff regulations. Small dogs or other small animals (not venomous, odoriferous or otherwise objectionable) when carried in baskets or containers, may be taken into drawing rooms, compartments, roomettes or bedrooms in parlor or sleeping cars.

### LOST ARTICLES—BAGGAGE CLAIMS

Passengers who have lost articles in coaches or at stations or who wish to make inquiry regarding baggage will please communicate with nearest agent or with the Manager M. B. & E. S., Room 270, Union Station, 517 W. Adams St., Chicago 6, Illinois. Articles lost in Pullman cars, if found, are returned to that company, and report of loss should be made direct to the Pullman Company.

### REFUNDS

Ticket agents will make refunds on wholly unused local and GM&O interline, one-way and round-trip tickets. They will also make refund on wholly unused return portions of local and GM&O interline tickets (provided no baggage checked), if presented within 30 days after date of sale.

Refund on local tickets can be made by any agent.

Refund on GM&O interline tickets can be made only by the agent who sold the ticket.

All tickets can be redeemed any time by sending to the Passenger Traffic Department, 721 Olive Street, St. Louis 1, Missouri.

### LOST TICKETS

Obviously, the railroad company cannot replace lost tickets. If a ticket is lost, the passenger should purchase another ticket, take receipt, and should write to the Passenger Traffic Manager, Room 800, 721 Olive St., St. Louis 1, Mo., explaining the circumstances. If the ticket is found and returned unused, the company will refund the additional fare paid.

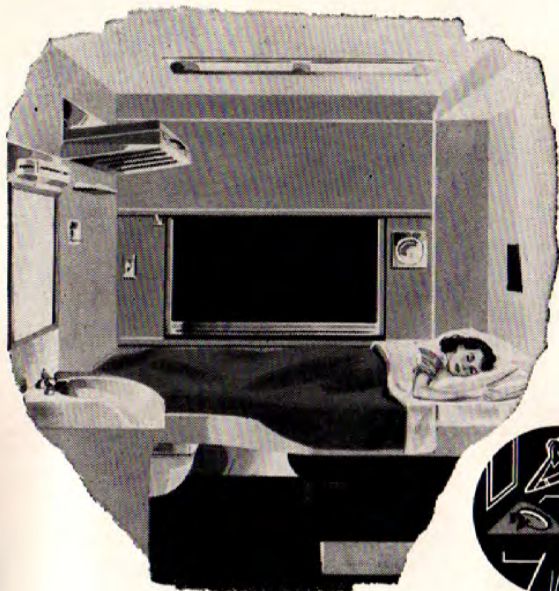
### GENERAL INFORMATION
