ABOUT GM&O'S CONVENIENT DOWNTOWN DEPOT AND TRANSFER SERVICE AT ST. LOUIS

ST. LOUIS DOWNTOWN DEPOT

G. M. & O. uses the Greyhound Terminal at Broadway and Delmar as its passenger depot in St. Louis, Mo. This terminal is conveniently located in the heart of the business and shopping district and affords complete facilities for the traveling public. (G. M. & O. trains do not operate into the Union Station at St. Louis.)

NEW EAST ST. LOUIS STATION

G. M. & O. maintains its own trackside passenger depot in East St. Louis, Ill. located on Front St. near Trendley Ave. This new and modern terminal affords complete depot facilities and is easily accessible.

CONNECTING TRANSFER SERVICE BETWEEN ST. LOUIS AND EAST ST. LOUIS AT NO EXTRA CHARGE

G. M. & O. provides connecting bus and taxi service, at no extra charge, between the E. St. Louis Trendley Ave. station and the St. Louis Downtown Depot and St. Louis Union Station, as explained below:

Southbound Passengers from St. Louis Proper are handled by our Rebeliner buses from the St. Louis Downtown Depot direct to the East St. Louis Trendley Ave. Station. (No service provided from Union Station for passengers from St. Louis proper.)

Southbound Through Passengers Arriving at St. Louis Union Station on Trains of Connecting Lines and holding tickets for G. M. & O. "Rebels" should show their ticket to Yellow Cab starter at Union Station who will send you by taxi to the Downtown Rebel Station at Broadway and Delmar, St. Louis (Greyhound Terminal); or if time is short the taxi will take you direct to the "Rebels" at our E. St. Louis Trendley Ave. Station. (Bus does not pick up passengers at St. Louis Union Station.)

Northbound Passengers to St. Louis Proper arriving E. St. Louis on the "Rebels" are transferred by Rebeliner bus from the E. St. Louis Trendley Ave. Station direct to the St. Louis Downtown Depot, or to St. Louis Union Station if desired.

Northbound Through Passengers Arriving East St. Louis on the Rebels" making connection with other trains at St. Louis Union Station are transferred by Rebeliner buses from the East St. Louis Trendley Ave. Station DIRECT TO ST. LOUIS UNION STATION.

BAGGAGE

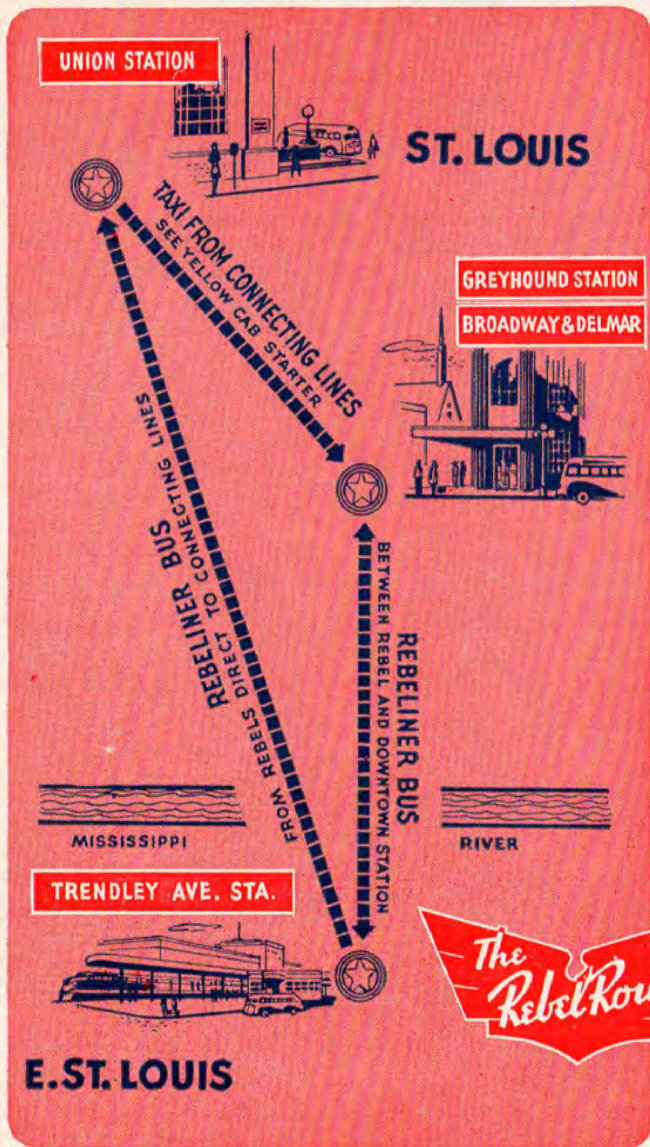
Southbound Passengers Boarding "G. M. & O. Bus" at the St. Louis Downtown Depot (Greyhound Terminal) should check all baggage at this station. Hand baggage not checked thru to destination will be delivered to your seat on the "Rebel" by our attendants.

Hand Baggage of Northbound Passengers for St. Louis Proper will be checked on the "Rebel" and handled from your seat by our attendants to the St. Louis Downtown Depot (Greyhound Terminal) where baggage should be claimed.

Hand Baggage of Through Northbound Passengers making connection with other trains at St. Louis Union Station will be checked on the "Rebel" and handled from your seat by our attendants to St. Louis Union Station, where baggage should be claimed when you leave the bus at Union Station.

All checked baggage, including trunks, handled in baggage cars to St. Louis proper, should be claimed at the St. Louis Downtown Depot (Greyhound Terminal).

All through checked baggage, including trunks and corpse, handled in baggage cars, is transferred between the East St. Louis Trendley Ave. station and connecting line trains at the St. Louis Union Station, without additional charge.

INFORMATION FOR TRAVELERS

TICKETS INTERCHANGEABLE ON BUSES AND TRAINS, see "Rebelineer Bus Service" on page 10.

Passengers are requested to purchase tickets before boarding trains.

Children under five years of age, in charge of a competent person, are carried free; those five years of age and under twelve, are required to pay half fare; those twelve years of age and over, full fare.

Limit of Tickets and Stopover Privileges: One-way tickets are limited to thirty (30) days in addition to date of sale and stopovers may be made at any station enroute within final limit of ticket. To secure stopover passenger should notify conductor who will endorse ticket and return to passenger. Stopover is also permitted on round trip tickets sold at regular round trip fares, on application to Conductor.

Redemption of Tickets: Tickets of this Company's issue that have not been used, or only a portion of which has been used will be redeemed under tariff regulations at proper value through the office of Passenger Traffic Manager, Mobile, Ala.

Tickets to Mobile and New Orleans Interchangeable: Return portion of round trip tickets sold at stations St. Louis, Mo. to Jackson, Tenn. inclusive, or beyond, as provided in tariffs, via Gulf, Mobile & Ohio R. R. to New Orleans, La. will, without additional charge, be exchanged by Gulf, Mobile & Ohio R. R. at Mobile, Ala. for tickets reading via Gulf, Mobile & Ohio R.R. from Mobile, Ala. to station at which purchased. Passengers must make their own arrangements for transportation from New Orleans, La. to Mobile, Ala.

Return portion of round trip tickets sold at stations St. Louis, Mo. to Jackson, Tenn. inclusive, or beyond, as provided in tariffs, via Gulf, Mobile & Ohio R. R. to Mobile, Ala. will upon additional payment of \$2.25 be exchanged by Gulf, Mobile & Ohio R. R. at New Orleans, La. for tickets reading via Gulf, Mobile & Ohio R. R. from New Orleans, La. to station at which purchased. Passengers must make their own arrangements for transportation from Mobile, Ala. to New Orleans, La.

BAGGAGE: Net exceeding 150 pounds in weight or \$100.00 in value, will be checked free for a passenger upon presentation of one adult passage ticket and baggage, not exceeding 75 pounds in weight or \$50.00 in value will be checked free for a child traveling on a half-fare ticket. Baggage weighing in excess of the above free allowance will be charged for in accordance with published tariffs. No single piece of baggage weighing more than 300 pounds, or having dimensions exceeding 72 inches, or valued at more than \$2,500.00 will be transported as baggage, except as provided for by tariff.

Unless a greater sum be declared by the passenger and excess valuation charges be paid therefor according to tariff regulations, the value of baggage weighing 150 pounds or less, checked for an adult is agreed not to exceed \$100.00 in value and the value of baggage weighing 75 pounds or less for a child traveling on a half-fare ticket is agreed not to exceed \$50.00.

This Company does not guarantee to forward baggage on same train with passenger or within a specified time limit but reserves the right to forward it upon any preceding or following train. To facilitate prompt receipt of their baggage at destination, passengers are requested to forward same on a preceding train.

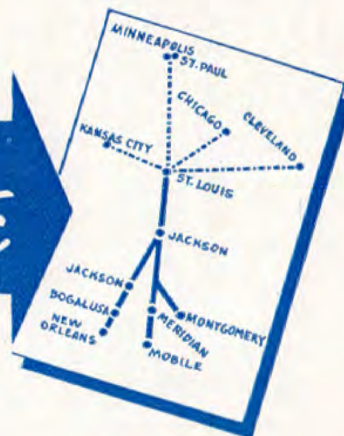

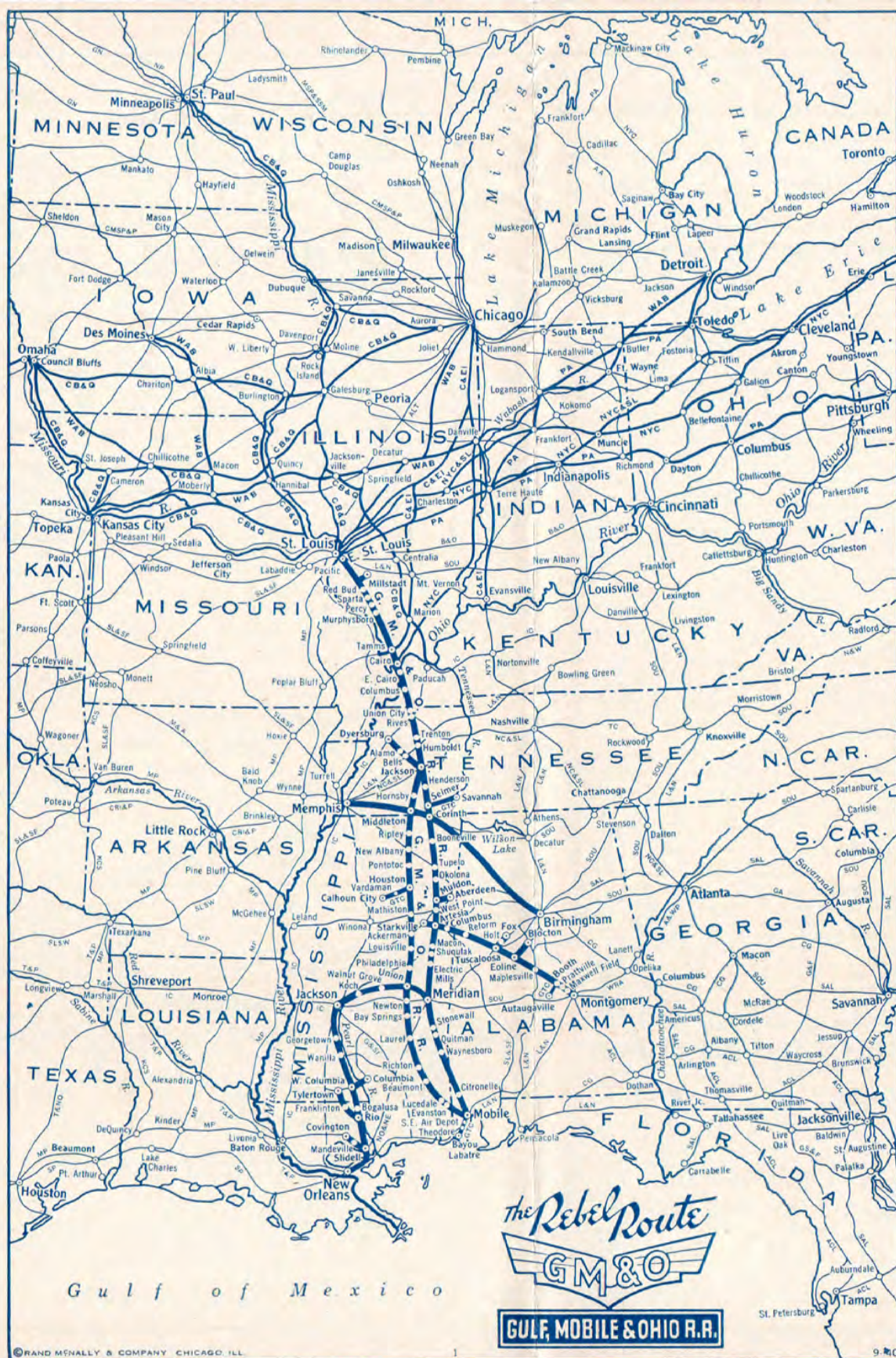
