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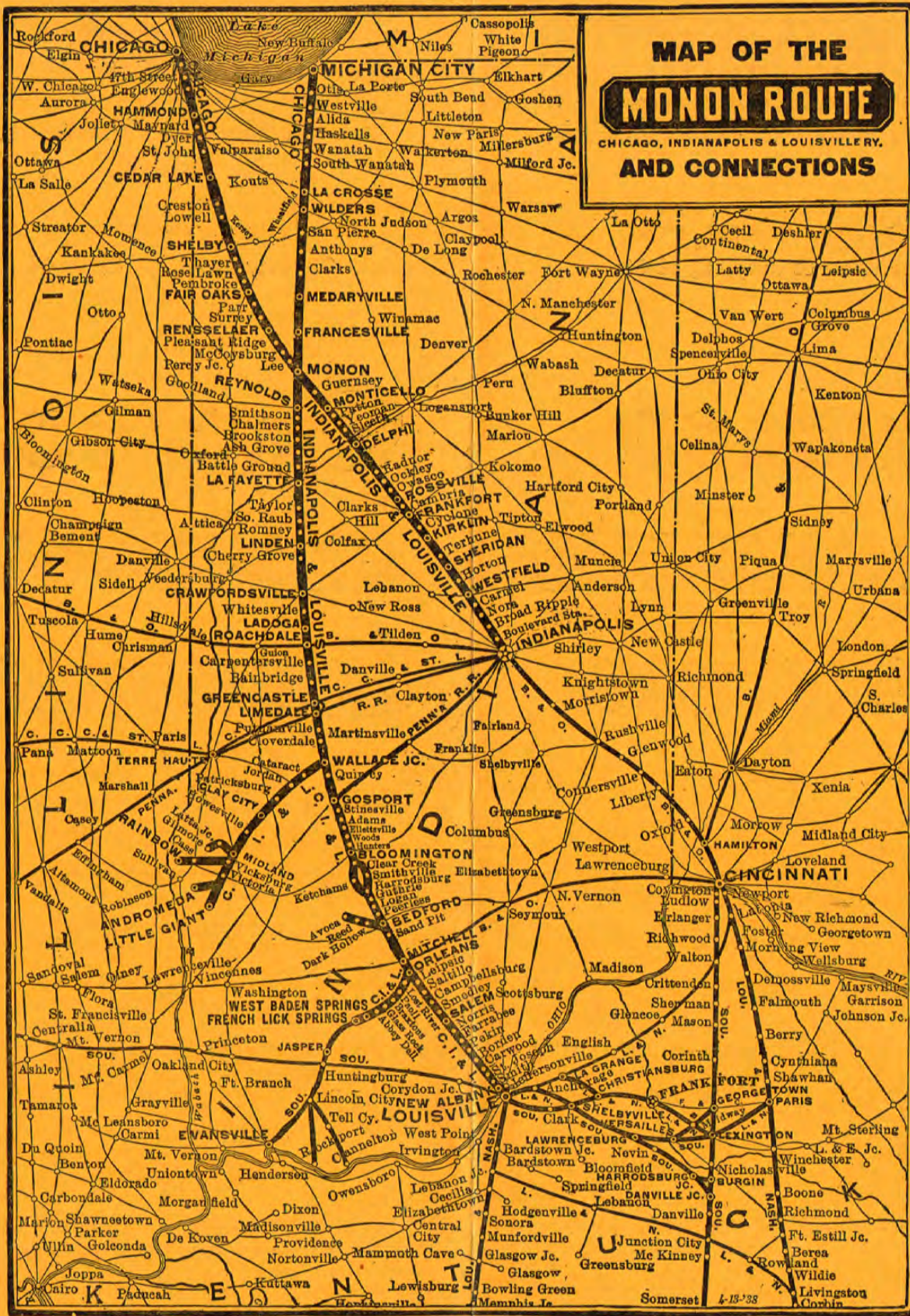

## GENERAL INFORMATION

Not Responsible. This Company will not be responsible for errors in time tables, inconvenience or damage resulting from delayed trains or failure to make connection; schedules herein are subject to change without notice.

Buy Tickets before boarding trains and avoid payment of extra charge.

Children under 5 years of age free, when accompanied by parent or guardian; 5 years of age and under 12, one-half fare; 12 years of age or over, full fare.

Adjustment of Fares. In cases of dispute with Conductors or Agents, pay the fare required, take receipt and communicate with H. B. Willis, General Passenger Agent, Chicago.

Redemption of Tickets. Tickets unused, or partly used, will be redeemed under tariff regulations at proper value.

Baggage. 150 pounds of baggage will be carried free on each whole ticket and 75 pounds on each half ticket.

Baggage Maximums. No single piece of baggage exceeding 300 pounds in weight, or 72 inches in greatest dimension, or single shipment exceeding \$2,500.00 in value will be checked. Free allowances subject to tariff stipulations as to contents, weight, value and size.

Liability Limited. Excess value to be declared and paid for at time of checking.

Bicycles (not Motorcycles), Baby Carriages, Dogs, and Guns are transported in baggage cars subject to tariff regulations.

Lost Articles should be inquired for through General Passenger Department, Chicago, Superintendent, LaFayette, Ind., or nearest representative.

The Railroad Company will not be responsible for unchecked articles left in stations or cars.

Lost Tickets. If you lose your railroad ticket give notice of your loss to the Conductor. Pay cash fare on train or purchase another ticket taking receipt in either case. Forward receipt with details of the loss to the General Passenger Agent of the road from which you bought the original ticket, and you will be advised whether or not any refund can properly be made.

Chicago Transfer. A uniformed agent of the Parmelee Company meets all incoming trains of the Monon Route, at Dearborn Station. Passengers may arrange with him for transfer of themselves and their baggage to other Railway Stations or to hotels in the business district, also for the handling of their baggage from Dearborn Station to any city address.

Travelers Aid. Representatives of National Travelers Aid Society are at many of the larger stations for purposes of relief of distress and assistance of unprotected. Those in need of such service should inquire of the station force for a National Travelers Aid Society representative.

Time from 12.01 midnight to 12.00 noon is shown by LIGHT faced figures, and time from 12.01 noon to 12.00 midnight by HEAVY faced figures.

Lower berth for night service, upper unused and in daytime position.

For exclusive occupancy of drawing rooms following number passage tickets, valid for transportation in Parlor or Sleeping cars, will be required.

Drawing Room in Sleeping Cars—Berth Service—One ticket for each passenger with a minimum of one and one quarter adult fare—Seat Service—One ticket for each person with a minimum of two adult fares.

Drawing Room—Parlor car, two adult tickets and three seat fares, with an additional seat fare for each passenger in excess of three.

Hand-baggage in Pullman cars is restricted to what can be conveniently placed in the berth, seat or other accommodations purchased by the passenger.
