Penn Central endeavors to furnish satisfactory service to its patrons, and you are requested to report any instances of inattention or incivility on the part of its employees. Suggestions for the improvement of the service are always welcome. Every precaution is taken to publish correct schedules, but the times shown cannot be guaranteed. The Company is not responsible for errors in timetables nor for inconvenience or damage resulting from delayed trains or failure to make connections, or for shortage of equipment. Although it rarely happens, schedules are subject to change without notice.



TIME from 12:01 midnight to 12:00 noon is shown in light-face figures and time from 12:01 noon to and including 12:00 midnight in bold face figures.

Limit of one-way tickets between stations on the **Penn Central** is one year, limit of round trip tickets is shown thereon.

STOP-OVERS are allowed on one way; and regular round trip tickets (not excursion) at any station enroute, within the final limit, upon application to the conductor.

STOPPING TRAINS ON SIGNAL. To board a train scheduled to stop only on signal, notify the ticket agent. Where there is no agent, indicate by hand signal desire to board train. To leave train, notify the conductor upon boarding train.

INVALIDS AND INFIRM PASSENGERS. Wheel chair service is available at principal stations. This company will gladly arrange for same if advance notice is furnished to the Station Master or to any Passenger Traffic Representative of the company. Any person who, because of mental, physical or other disability is incapable of properly caring for himself or herself will be transported as a passenger only when accompanied by a competent attendant.

CHILDREN'S FARES. Children five years of age and under twelve years travel for half the adult fare while for children twelve years of age and over the fare is the same as for adults. Children under five years of age, when accompanied by parent or guardian travel without charge, however, if parlor car seat is occupied one-half adult fare is required, plus seat fare. Consult Ticket Agent for ticket requirements when children occupy sleeping car space.

FAMILY FARES. Family fares are in effect on the **Penn Central** for round trip travel, when the one way coach fare is \$1.00 or more. These fares are also available for interline travel under various conditions.

RESERVATIONS. Any ticket agent will assist in obtaining space for you in Parlor or Sleeping Cars. It will help in planning your trip if reservations are made and tickets purchased as early as possible. Reservations made in name are limited as to length of time they will be held and tickets must be purchased before expiration of the time limit. Should your travel plans change, please cancel your reservations immediately so that the space will be available to others. Refund will be made on Parlor Car tickets if space is cancelled in time to permit resale prior to departure of train or if like accommodations in the same train for sale between points on the ticket were available at train departure time. To obtain complete information pertaining to refunds, please ask your ticket agent. One 1/2 transportation fare is required when seat or berth is occupied by one or more children under 5 years of age. Two 1/2 transportation fares will cover exclusive occupancy of section by two children of half-fare age.

When members of the same family or party occupy one or more drawing rooms, single or double bedrooms, roomettes, compartments, sections, or berths on the same train, additional transportation tickets will not be required if the total number of Sleeping Car transportation tickets presented for each member of the entire family or party is equivalent to the minimum requirement for the exclusive occupancy of the total space occupied by the entire family or party.

For minimum number of transportation tickets required for exclusive occupancy in Sleeping and Parlor Cars operated by other railroads, passengers should consult Ticket Agent.

TRAVELERS AID. Representatives of Travelers' Aid Society are at many of the larger stations for the purpose of relieving distress and assisting the unprotected.

Enroute, train and dining car personnel will render every possible assistance to those travelling with children.

BAGGAGE: You are urged to check all baggage, except what is needed enroute and to be sure your baggage is clearly marked with name and permanent address. Checked baggage service is not available at all stations. Consult originating ticket or baggage agent in advance to determine if baggage service is available at destination station. Checkable baggage is defined as personal effects in use or necessary for the journey (but does not include liquids, jewelry, money, negotiable papers, fragile articles, typewriters, radios or foodstuffs). The carriers assume no responsibility for loss or damage to or caused by any excluded items.

Subject to tariff regulations, 150 pounds will be transported on full fare ticket and 75 pounds on half fare ticket without charge, except a service charge of 35 cents will be assessed for each suitcase or other piece of hand baggage and 75 cents for each trunk at time of checking. Containers must be made of strong material for checked service.

A single piece must not exceed 300 lbs. Free allowance on adult tickets is 150 lbs. and \$100.00 declared valuation (in writing). Extra value may be declared at low rates (maximum \$2500.00 per shipment).

Every effort is extended for prompt handling of baggage but no guarantee can be given as to handling on same train as owner nor arrival time at destination.

Delivery service may be arranged in principal cities direct to Steamship Piers and business, or private addresses on payment of delivery charges.

CHECK BAGGAGE A DAY IN ADVANCE. It is good practice to check baggage one day in advance of trip and we so recommend. Twenty-four (24) hours free storage time after arrival of baggage at destinations is allowed.

STORAGE. A charge is made for storage of baggage left at railroad stations longer than the free time limit.

RED CAP PORTER SERVICE. Red Cap Station Attendants, who are selected employees, are available at principal stations to handle passenger's baggage at nominal charge per piece of hand baggage.

Railroad liability for loss or damage is limited to \$50.00 per bag or parcel, but greater value at low rates can be declared in writing at baggage rooms in accord with tariff which is available for inspection at stations.

TRANSPORTING PETS. Dogs and small household pets (such as cats, birds, etc.) are not permitted in coaches (except in carrying cases and when not offensive to passengers), but may be checked in sturdy, well-ventilated container for handling in baggage cars, subject to tariff and State regulations. Exceptions are made for Guide Dogs accompanying blind persons. Dogs, cats or other animals (not venomous or otherwise objectionable) may be taken into private room accommodations in parlor cars or sleeping cars, but not more than two animals may be taken into any one room. The animals must be in suitable containers when taken to and from rooms, however, dogs may be on leash and muzzled in lieu of in container. Animals must be kept in private room space and will not be allowed in other parts of car except to get to and from private room, or in Lounges, Club, Dining or Grill Cars.

LOST ARTICLES. Loss of personal articles left in coaches or Parlor Cars and Sleepers between Boston and New York and Washington, D. C. should be reported promptly to nearest ticket agent or passenger representative, with full description of article, train and date on which lost. Parlor or Sleeping Car number, and points between which you travelled. Every effort will be made to recover your property, but no liability can be assumed on un-checked articles. Inquiry may also be addressed to Manager, Baggage, Mail and Express Traffic, Boston, Mass. 02210.

REDEMPTION OF TICKETS. The redemption value on tickets issued by **Penn Central** will be refunded to the original purchaser upon presentation of tickets at any ticket office, at Passenger Traffic Department offices Railroad Station in New Haven or they may be mailed to the Manager of Passenger Accounting, New Haven, Connecticut 06506. Wholly unused tickets are redeemed at the tariff fare paid subject to a service charge which is deducted from the refund. Partially used tickets are redeemed after determining the difference between the amount paid and the actual value of the transportation performed on the basis of the lowest applicable tariff fare with a similar service charge deducted from the amount of refund. Tickets for parlor car space may be redeemed by Ticket Agent if space is cancelled in time to permit it to be replaced on sale before departure of train for which sold. Should it not be possible for Ticket Agent to make immediate refund, agent will forward ticket to Manager Passenger Accounting for adjustment.

Redemption of tickets subject to a service charge for Sleeping Car accommodations issued by the **Penn Central** may be made by Ticket Agent if space is cancelled the day before train is placed for occupancy, except that during the period December 1 to April 30, inclusive, tickets for Sleeping Car accommodations in through cars operated to destinations in the State of Florida south of Jacksonville and Baldwin, will be redeemed if space is released on or before the third day preceding the day train is placed for occupancy. Otherwise tickets should be sent to Manager Passenger Accounting New Haven, Conn. 06506 for tickets issued by **Penn Central**.

ADJUSTMENT OF FARES. In event of disagreement with conductor or agent, pay the fare required, take receipt and communicate with Passenger Traffic Department, New Haven, Conn. 06506.

A TIME AND TROUBLE SAVER. Western Union telegrams may be sent from any telegraph station. Domestic Service; Full Rate Telegrams (fast service at reasonable rates). Day Letters (inexpensive deferred service), Night Letters (overnight service at reduced rates.)

Parlor, Sleeping and Dining Car Service

Air-conditioned equipment is assigned as far as possible, but the right is reserved to employ non-air-conditioned cars in emergencies or when the volume of traffic makes it necessary. When regular trains are operated in two sections, the coach section may not have a meal car.

USE OF PARLOR CAR FACILITIES

Where Buffet Parlor cars are operated, the accommodations, facilities and services provided therein are available only to passengers holding tickets for space in such cars, or other Parlor Cars or Sleeping Cars on the same train, and railroad tickets good for travel in Parlor Cars, or paying the Parlor seat fare and additional railroad fare for the distance travelled in such cars, when space is available therein. All Parlor Car service is operated by the Railroad Companies.

SLEEPING CAR ACCOMMODATIONS

The various types of sleeping car accommodations shown herein are usually available, however, it is sometimes necessary to make revisions in the style of cars operated on Saturday nights and during holiday periods. All sleeping car service is operated by the Railroad Companies.

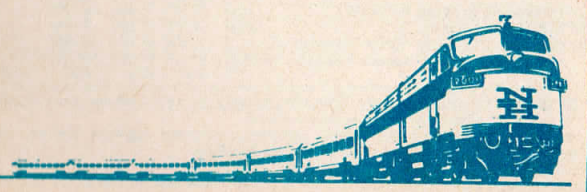
