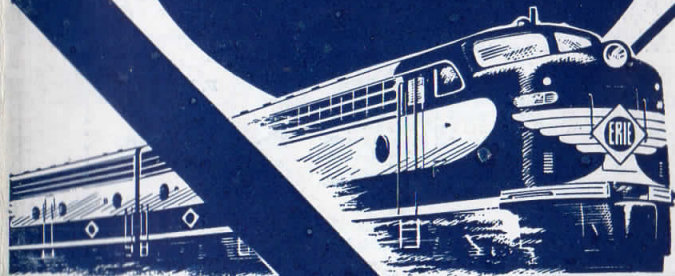

Reading of Tables

On all tables, the schedule of each individual train is shown in a separate column. Each train has an operating number which appears at the top of the schedule column.

Train times from 12:01 a.m. (Midnight) to 12:00 Noon inclusive, are printed in light-faced figures; 12:01 p.m. (Noon) to 12:00 Midnight are printed in dark-face throughout the timetable.

Trains make regular stops only at stations where time figures appear in column opposite the station name. Symbols are opposite some schedule figures. They are important. They indicate exceptions and should be checked carefully with explanation under Reference Notes at the bottom of each page.

When trains are shown as Stopping Conditionally at a Station, passengers should advise Station Agent, in advance, of their intention to board train or notify Conductor of intention to leave train, as case may be.

On main line Table 4, where a station name is indented, that station is located on a Branch Line or connecting service.

The equipment of principal trains is shown on pages 9, 10, 23 and 24. Coach equipment is carried on all trains.

General Information

Erie Lines east of and including Ohio City, Ohio, are shown in EASTERN DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME. Lines west of Ohio City, Ohio in CENTRAL DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME.

THIS COMPANY IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ERRORS in timetables, inconvenience or damage resulting from delayed trains, or failure to make connections; schedules and equipment shown herein are subject to change without notice.

The term MAJOR HOLIDAYS (as shown in the notes on various tables) refers to New Year's Day, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. When any of the Major Holidays mentioned fall on Sunday and are observed on the following Monday, these Mondays will be considered as Major Holidays.

The term MINOR HOLIDAYS (as shown in the notes on various tables) refers to Lincoln's Birthday, Columbus Day, Election Day and Veterans' Day.

The term ALL HOLIDAYS (as shown in the notes on various tables) refers to all Major and Minor Holidays listed above.

CHILDREN under five years of age are carried free when accompanied by parent or guardian; five years of age and under twelve, half fare; twelve years of age and over, full fare.

Should ANY MISUNDERSTANDING arise with conductors or agents, pay the fare required, take receipt and communicate with Passenger Traffic Manager, Midland Bldg., Cleveland, Ohio.

TICKETS UNUSED or partly used will be redeemed under tariff regulations at proper value. Railroads are not responsible for lost tickets or baggage checks.

A STOP-OVER within final limit will be granted on tickets sold at regular fares at all stations on the Erie Railroad (with certain exceptions in the New York suburban area).

WHEN ARTICLES ARE LOST on trains or left in waiting rooms, owners should apply at once to Agent at station where they leave train or address Manager, Baggage Traffic, Erie Railroad Company, Hoboken, N. J., giving full description of property, stating date of loss and train number.

150 pounds of baggage may be checked on adult tickets and 75 pounds on half fare tickets subject to tariff stipulations as to contents, weight, value and size. A service charge of 25c will be collected for each piece of hand baggage and 50c for each trunk.

Personal baggage is wearing apparel, toilet articles (except liquid) and personal effects in actual use and necessary and appropriate for the purpose of the journey and not intended for other persons or for sale. Articles which may not be included in personal baggage are shown in published tariff which is on file at stations.

Baggage to be checked should be delivered at stations reasonably in advance of train departure. The railroad cannot guarantee to forward baggage on same train with passenger and when necessary will be forwarded on other trains. To facilitate prompt receipt of baggage at destination, passengers are urged to arrange for forwarding on a preceding train.

A charge is made for storage of baggage at destination when it is not claimed within full time limit.

BAGGAGE WILL NOT BE REMOVED FROM TRAINS AT STATIONS WHEN AGENT IS NOT ON DUTY TO RECEIVE IT.

ALL BAGGAGE CHECKED IN BAGGAGE CAR TO OR FROM NEW YORK CITY will be sent to Barclay Street Station.

BAGGAGE CHECKED FOR HANDLING IN BAGGAGE CAR WILL NOT BE CARRIED ON MOTOR COACHES.

BAGGAGE INSURANCE may be purchased at principal Erie Ticket Offices. It insures your baggage and personal effects for your entire trip anywhere in the world. Minimum premium twenty-five cents. Ask Ticket Agent for full particulars.

BAGGAGE may be checked through to house address, hotel, steamship dock, etc., at destination. Reliable transfer companies perform this service at nominal charges at all principal cities.

HAND BAGGAGE in coaches or Pullman cars is restricted to what can be conveniently placed in accommodations purchased by passenger. It is urged that passengers carry with them only such baggage as required for their immediate needs. Other baggage may be checked in baggage car at a nominal charge.

RED CAP PORTER SERVICE is available at principal stations at a charge of 25c, except at Cleveland Union Terminal where charge is 35c, for each bag or parcel. Carriers' liability is limited to not more than \$50.00 for each bag or parcel unless greater value declared in writing on form provided for that purpose.

Declaration form available at baggage room. An additional charge of 20c per bag or parcel will be made for each \$100.00 or fraction thereof, declared in excess of \$50.00. A bag or parcel having value in excess of \$500.00 will not be accepted under any circumstances.

FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY—don't get on or off a train in motion; wait for a full stop. Keep hand baggage out of car aisles. Walk carefully when entering or leaving train; high-heeled shoes are sometimes a cause of tripping or stumbling on car steps. Don't stand or walk close to the railroad track; look both ways before starting across.

PREPAID TICKET ORDERS—for patrons who do not wish to send money by mail, Erie Railroad Ticket Agents sell prepaid ticket orders for the delivery of transportation, rail and Pullman, from practically all points in the United States, Canada and Mexico. These orders may also include the furnishing of cash.

In an emergency, arrangement may be made for the delivery of transportation by telegraph or telephone without charge except when commercial wires are used. Consult Ticket Agents for details.

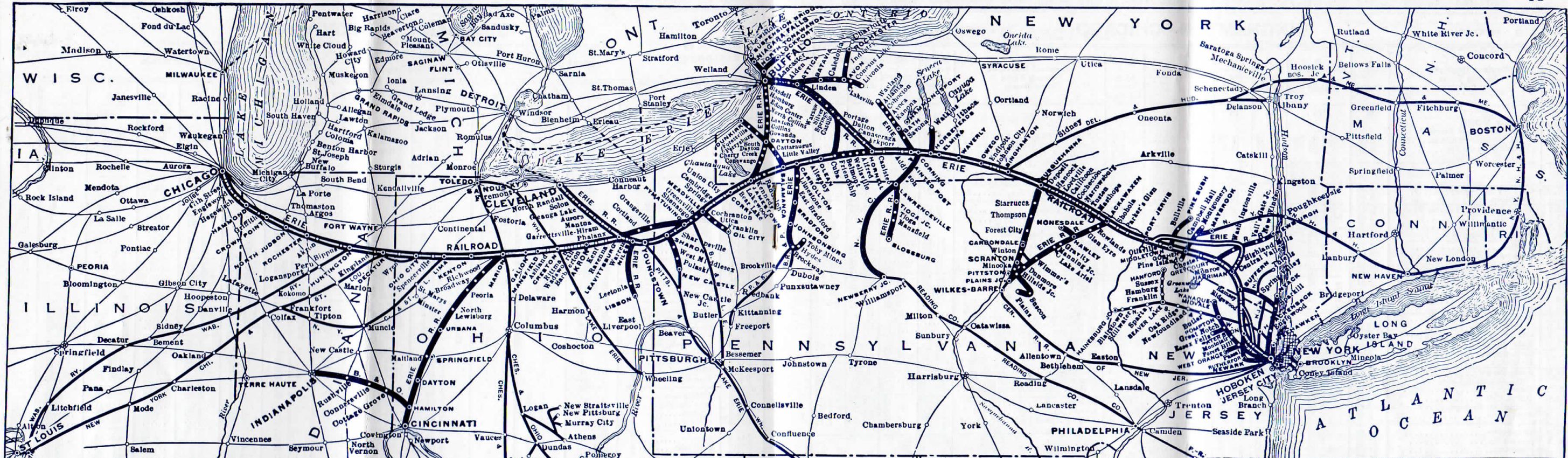

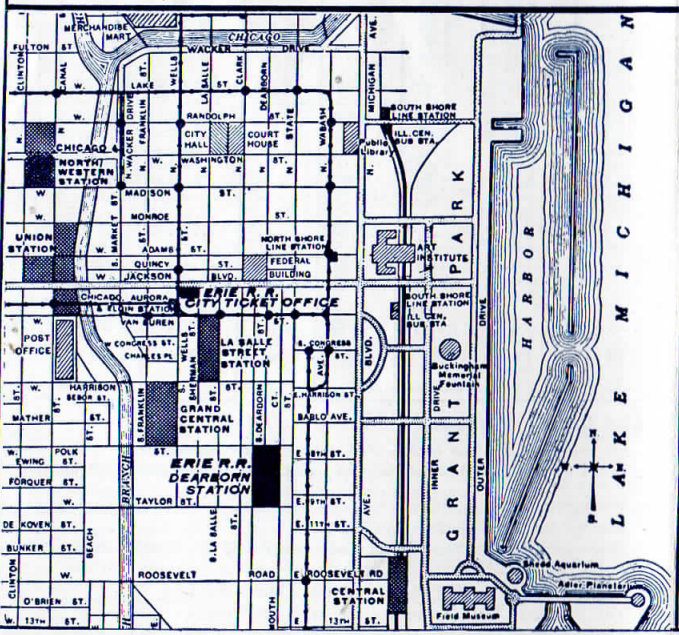

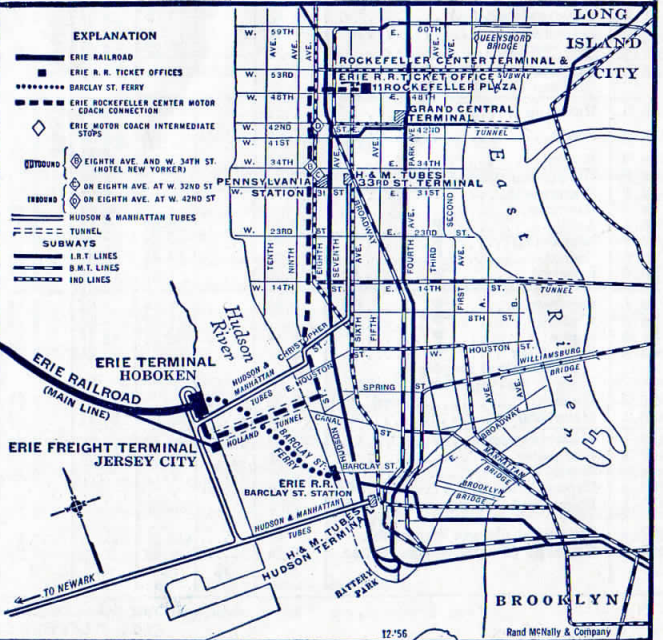




**MAP OF DOWNTOWN CHICAGO**
