Special Service Charge in Reserved-Seat Coaches

A special service charge of \$2.00 is assessed for each coach seat assigned to and from points north of Washington. The charge for each seat assigned between other points is 50c and \$1.00, according to the distance travelled. No charge applies on intrastate travel in Florida.

Reference Marks

B—Stops to discharge or receive revenue passengers from or for Jacksonville and points north or west thereof.

D—Stops to discharge or receive revenue passengers from or for Washington, D. C. and beyond.

E—Stops to discharge or receive revenue passenger from or for Fort Pierce and points north, and from or for Miami.

Information for Passengers

BAGGAGE MARKINGS. All baggage to be transported under check should be plainly and substantially marked with the name and address of the owner.

BAGGAGE MAXIMA. No single piece of baggage exceeding 300 pounds in weight, or single shipment exceeding \$2,500.00 in value will be checked. Cardboard cartons cannot exceed 50 pounds in weight.

BAGGAGE VALUATION. Passengers have the privilege of declaring the value of their baggage with the idea of having the carriers assume a greater liability than \$100 provided for in the ticket contract. The charge for this is 25 cents for each \$100 of increased value.

BAGGAGE CHECKED TO NON-AGENCY STATIONS. When baggage is forwarded under check to a station where an agent will not be on duty upon the arrival of this particular train, it must be claimed at the baggage car door immediately upon arrival at that station. Otherwise it will be carried to the first station where agent is on duty and held for further advices.

BABY CARRIAGES, CRIBS or PLAY PENS, GO-CARTS, VELOCIPEDES and GOLF CARTS are now transported in baggage cars as part of baggage allowance.

LOST ARTICLES. For articles left in Pullman cars, communications should be addressed to the Superintendent of the Pullman Company at Jacksonville, Fla. However, inquiries addressed to the General Passenger Agent of the Florida East Coast Railway at St. Augustine will be given prompt attention. No responsibility is assumed for articles left at station or in coaches.

SUBJECT TO CHANGE WITHOUT NOTICE. The Florida East Coast Railway assumes no responsibility for inconveniences or damages resulting from delayed trains, errors in time tables or failure to make advertised connections. Schedules are subject to change without notice.

CHILDREN. For children under five years of age, when accompanied by parents or guardian, no charge will be made.

For children five years of age and under twelve, the charge will be on the basis of one-half of the regular fare for an adult person.

For children twelve years of age and over, full fare will be charged.

REDEMPTION OF TICKETS. Unused tickets will be redeemed under current regulations which provide for proper deductions, in case baggage has been checked or the ticket partly used. Upon application to the local agent, a form will be supplied which must be filled in; or communication addressed to the General Passenger Agent at St. Augustine will be given prompt consideration.

ADJUSTMENT OF DIFFERENCES. In case of disagreement with an Agent or Conductor as to the proper amount to be collected, we ask that the passenger make payment in accordance with the demands of the employee, and take a receipt dated and signed. The question should then be referred to the General Passenger Agent at St. Augustine who will give it prompt attention.

STOP-OVERS. One-way tickets are limited to 30 days, in addition to date of sale and stop-overs at intermediate stations are allowed upon application to conductors.

On round-trip tickets stop-overs are allowed at intermediate station in both directions within the final limit.

TICKETS WILL NOT BE SOLD to crippled persons or those who are too ill to adequately care for themselves, unless accompanied by a competent person in charge; to persons who are intoxicated or whose conduct might be annoying or hazardous to other passengers.
