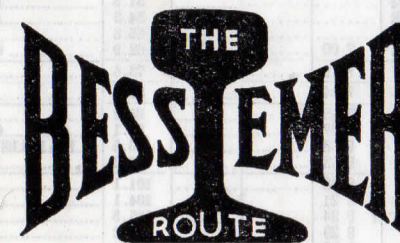

This Company accepts at Public Telegraph Stations of this road NIGHT LETTERS of fifty words or less at the regular rate for a ten-word day message. DAY LETTERS, fifty words, at rate of one and a half toll for ten-word day message.

Reference Marks: f-Flag Stop, train stops only on notice to agent or conductor. Light face type indicates A. M. time. Heavy face type indicates P. M. time. ‡ No baggage service on Trains 43 and 44. a-West Jefferson is a flag stop for No. 1 on Mondays and for No. 2 on Fridays.

Trains arrive at and depart from B. & L. E. R. R. Depot, Center Avenue, Butler, a short distance from the B. & O. R. R. Depot.

NOTES—MAIN LINE TRAINS

- No. 1—Daily except Sunday, Greenville to East Pittsburgh, connecting at Butler with B. & O. R. R. Arrive Pittsburgh, 11:05 A. M.
- No. 2—Daily except Sunday, East Pittsburgh to Greenville, with connection at Butler from Pittsburghs. Lv. Pittsburgh B. & O. R. R. 3:10 P. M.

CHILDREN under 5 years of age free, when accompanied by parent or guardian; 5 years of age and under 12, one-half fare; 12 years of age or over, full fare.
