# SAFETY FIRST ALWAYS

#### SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

- (1)—Northward Trains are Superior to Trains of the same Class in Opposite direction.
- (2)—The Operating Rules will be A. & ST. A. B. RY. Co. Standard Code of Rules.
- (3)—All Trains must obtain Clearance Card before leaving Panama City and Dothan.
- (4)—All Trains will Register at Panama City and Dothan.
- (5)—All Trains must come to complete stop before proceeding across L&N RR Crossing Cottondale then move forward slowly after giving proper Engine whistle signal. And if Necessary Flag.
- (6)—All Previous Time Tables and Schedules are hereby cancelled.
- (7)—AIR BRAKES—Not less than 85 per cent of all air brakes in train must be operative. Diesel Engines and caboose to be figured as one car each.
- (8)—Street Crossings in Incorporated Cities and Towns must not be blocked more than 5 minutes.
- (9)—A train not equipped to display Markers to the rear, will display a red flag by day and red light by night, to indicate rear of train.
- (10)—Trains going into or out of a siding must not exceed speed of 10 Miles per hour except pulling out of Long Lead North end Sherman Yard 20 Miles per hour. Madrid Pass Track, 30 Miles per hour.
- (11)—Wire connections portable telephones, two middle wires next to poles on each side.
- (12)—Air Brake test will be made by Inspectors Dothan and Panama City on All Trains.
- (13)—CAUTION—Employees are prohibited from riding forward footboard of pilot of engines except when moving at slow speed, for purposes of throwing switches, making couplings, flagging street crossings, or similar work. When necessity exists, they must place themselves on extreme right or left hand side of footboard or pilot.
- (14)—BULLETIN BOOKS—Train and engine crews will examine bulletin books before starting on each trip, date and sign same.
- (15)—Train Crews shall see that all air brakes are coupled and operative on all locomotives and cars while switching in a yard and side tracks, on a grade, on the wharf at Bay Harbor and transfer at Dothan. Cars shall not be left standing on a grade with only the air-brakes set. The hand-brake must also be set.
- (16)—All trains must be under perfect control within the yard limits at Dothan, Cottondale, and Panama City.
- (17)—Any and every new employee shall be considered as employed only from day to day until his employment shall have been approved by the Vice President. Applicants' records will be investigated; and should an applicant be rejected, no explanation as to the reason will be given him, as replies to inquiries are necessarily private.
- (18)—Only a few essential rules are set forth in this time-table. Common sense and good judgment should be exercised at all times; and Train and Engine Crews should use the motto: "Safety First" in all their movements.
- (19)—All Road Trains will burn headlight both day and night, also Yard Engines performing Transfer Service.
- (20)—SPEED LIMITS, MAXIMUM—Freight Trains 49 miles per hour, Passenger Trains 59 miles per hour, Passenger Trains 50 miles per hour on curves. Speed of all trains to be reduced when not consistent with safety.
