



UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA — Largest university in the world is a center for cultural and scientific achievement and atomic research. Campus and numerous displays are open to the public. Take buses 7, 40, 51, 58, 67, or F to campus in Berkeley.

WOODMINSTER AMPHITHEATER, Joaquin Miller Park — Scene of summer light opera productions under the stars in Oakland hills. Take bus 18 to Oakmead for special service direct to amphitheater entrance.

WILD LIFE REFUGE, Lakeside Park — First wild life refuge in North America provides winter sanctuary for thousands of migratory birds from Alaska, Canada, Siberia, and Greenland. Take buses 12, 18 or B to Grand and Perkins, or bus 34 to Grand and Stien, Oakland.



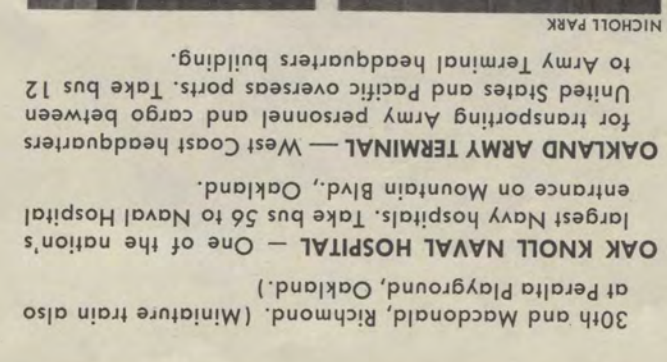

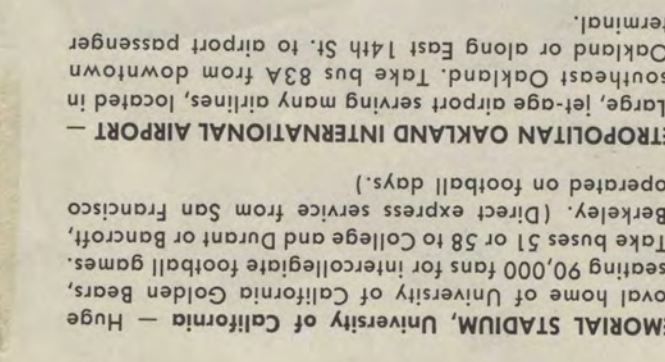

OAKLAND NAVAL HOSPITAL — One of the nation's largest Navy hospitals. Take bus 56 to Naval Hospital



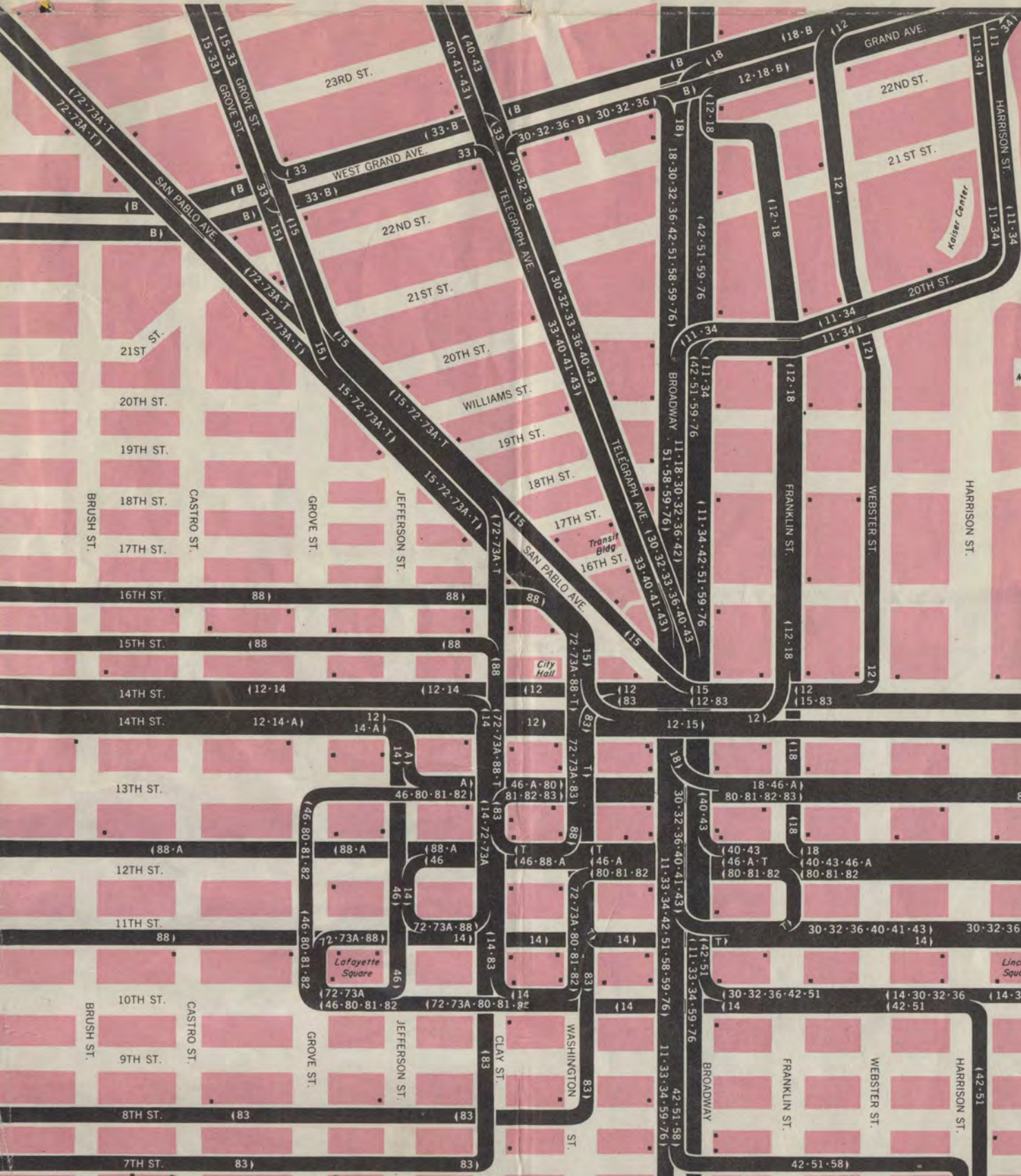
OAKLAND ARMY TERMINAL — West Coast headquarters for transporting Army personnel and cargo between United States and Pacific overseas ports. Take bus 12 to Army Terminal headquarters building.



MEMORIAL STADIUM, University of California — Huge oval home of University of California Golden Bears, seating 90,000 fans for intercollegiate football games. Take buses 51 or 58 to College and Durant or Bancroft, Berkeley. (Direct express service from San Francisco operated on football days.)



LAKE TEMESCAL, Temescal Regional Park — Named after famous Indian chief, park has swimming (June to September), bath houses, boating, fishing, hiking trails, picnic facilities and playgrounds. Take bus 59 to Warren Blvd. and Broadway Terrace, Oakland.

via 

ALAMEDA BEACHES — Washington Park, sandy bay beach, swimming, picnic facilities; take buses 51 or 58 to 8th and Central, walk two blocks south; or take bus 64 to 9th and Central, walk one block west. South Shore Beach, swimming; take bus 63 to Shoreline Dr. or bus 64 to Park and San Jose.

ALAMEDA NAVAL AIR STATION — West Coast port for fleet aircraft carriers. Technical training schools and world's largest overhaul and repair base for Navy aircraft are located here. Take bus 42 to Naval Air Station stop.

ART GALLERY, Oakland Auditorium — Million dollar collection of fine art, specializing in art of California from earliest times. Take buses 14, 15, 18, 40, 41, 43, 80, 81, 82, 83 or A to Oakland Auditorium stop.



BOATING

BAND CONCOURSE, Lakeside Park — Scene of Sunday afternoon band concerts on shore of Lake Merritt. Take buses 12, 18 or B to Grand and Park View Terrace, Oakland.

BEGONIA GARDENS, Lakeside Park — Large displays of begonias and nearby dahlia and chrysanthemum gardens provide continuous bloom from April to December. Take buses 12, 18, 34 or B to Grand and Park View Terrace, Oakland.

BOATING — Sailboats and canoes may be rented at Lake Merritt Boat House. Take bus 15 to Oak. Sailboats also available at Berkeley Aquatic Park. Take bus 51 to end of line at Southern Pacific Depot, Berkeley.

CALIFORNIA COLLEGE OF ARTS AND CRAFTS — Noted four-year art college founded in 1904 is located in former Treadwell mansion at 5212 Broadway, Oakland. Continuous exhibits of visiting artists, students and faculty open to public daily. Take buses 51, 58, 59 or 76 to College and Broadway.

CAMPANILE, University of California — Trips to top of 303 foot high university landmark offer wide vistas of San Francisco Bay area. Take buses 7, 40, 51, 58, 67, or F to University campus, Berkeley.

CASA PERALTA, 384 W. Estudillo Ave., San Leandro — Impressive gardens of early-day Peralta estate contain original Spanish tilework, fountains and adobe relics. Garden and courtyard open to public daily. Take buses 30, 80, 81, 82 or R to East 14th and Estudillo.

CHILDREN'S FAIRYLAND — World-famous land of childhood make-believe brings 50 nursery rhymes to life. Take buses 12, 18, 34 or B to Grand and Park View Terrace, Oakland.

CLAREMONT HOTEL — Old world charm and atmosphere of famous hotel located in 20 acre garden surroundings. Take buses 74 or E to Ashby and Domingo, Berkeley.

FISHING — Bait, tackle, poles, fishing supplies and boats available at mile-long Berkeley Fishing Pier. Take bus 51 to end of line at Southern Pacific Depot, Berkeley.

KEZAR STADIUM — Home playing field in Golden Gate Park for San Francisco 49'ers (San Francisco transit maps showing lines to stadium available at Transbay Transit Terminal Information Center).

GOLF COURSES — Alameda Municipal Golf Course. Take bus 63 or 79 to golf course clubhouse on Maitland. To Hayward Golf Course take bus 32 to Mission and Alquire Rd.

GREEK THEATER, University of California — Open-air setting for music and drama events and student rallies. Take buses 51 or 58 to College and Durant or Bancroft, Berkeley, for short walk north on College to theater.

HARRISON SQUARE RAILROAD MUSEUM — Historic collection of steam railroad equipment including 134-ton engine, cars, station and museum. Take buses 42, 51 or 58 to 7th and Harrison, Oakland.

HORSE RACING, Golden Gate Fields — Modern fast track, beautifully landscaped on edge of San Francisco Bay. Take bus L from San Francisco to Eastshore Freeway and Gilman, Berkeley, for short walk to track. During racing season take special L express from San Francisco direct to track; in East Bay take special express bus 94 from University and Shattuck, Berkeley.



JACK LONDON SQUARE

JACK LONDON SQUARE — Fine restaurants overlook bay shipping channel near colorful district of early waterfront saloons and Jack London's adventures. Take buses 11, 33, 34, 59 or 76 to foot of Broadway, Oakland.



MILLS COLLEGE

JAPANESE GARDEN, Lakeside Park — Ancient Oriental legends are depicted in traditional Japanese landscaping, Ykimi Doro lantern and stone bridges. Take buses 12, 18, 34 or B to Grand and Park View Terrace, Oakland.

KNOWLAND STATE PARK AND ARBORETUM — Elephant, lions, bears and monkeys are featured in zoo park, also many unusual varieties of trees. Facilities include merry-go-round, pony rides, rifle range and picnic area. Take bus 56 to Mountain and Golf Links Rd., Oakland.

LAKE EXCURSIONS — Excursions around Lake Merritt in heart of Oakland leave from Boat House on Oak St. Take bus 15 to Oak.

MEMORIAL STADIUM

MEMORIAL STADIUM, University of California — Huge oval home of University of California Golden Bears, seating 90,000 fans for intercollegiate football games. Take buses 51 or 58 to College and Durant or Bancroft, Berkeley. (Direct express service from San Francisco operated on football days.)

METROPOLITAN OAKLAND INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT — Large, jet-age airport serving many airlines, located in southeast Oakland. Take bus 83A from downtown Oakland or along East 14th St. to airport passenger terminal.

MILLS COLLEGE — Century-old school for women on picturesque 138-acre campus is renowned as a beauty spot of the West. Frequent music, drama, art events have established the college as a cultural center of the area. Take buses 34, 56, 57 or N to Seminary and MacArthur, Oakland.

NICHOLL PARK MINIATURE RAILROAD — Actual scale model of streamliner, also other children attractions, miniature farm zoo and aviaries. Take bus 72M or L to

30th and Macdonald, Richmond. (Miniature train also at Peralta Playground, Oakland.)

OAK KNOLL NAVAL HOSPITAL — One of the nation's largest Navy hospitals. Take bus 56 to Naval Hospital entrance on Mountain Blvd., Oakland.

OAKLAND ARMY TERMINAL — West Coast headquarters for transporting Army personnel and cargo between United States and Pacific overseas ports. Take bus 12 to Army Terminal headquarters building.

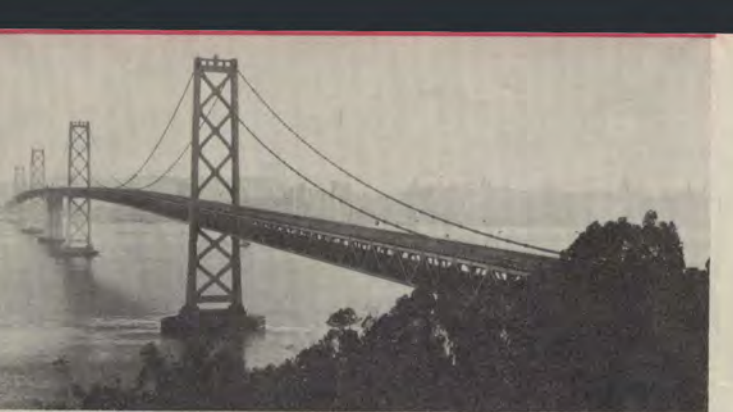

OAKLAND NAVAL SUPPLY CENTER — Supply distribution center for Navy ships and installations throughout entire Pacific and Far East area. Take bus 12 to Naval Supply Center.

PLAYLAND — City owned Peralta Playground features miniature railroad, pony rides, merry-go-round, boat

rides and picnic facilities. Take buses 14, 15, 18, 40, 41, 43, 80, 81, 82, 83 or A to Oakland Auditorium stop.

RICHMOND ART CENTER, Civic Center — Exhibits of modern, contemporary paintings, sculpture, ceramics, crafts, weaving, silk-screen and jewelry. Take buses 72M or L to 25th and Macdonald.

ROSE GARDENS — Morcom Amphitheater of Roses displays widely acclaimed collection of 8,000 bushes from March to December; take bus 12 to Grand and Jean

or bus 11 to Oakland Ave. and Olive Ave., Oakland. Berkeley Municipal Rose Garden contains thousands of rose bushes and trees in Berkeley hills. Take bus 7 to Euclid and Bay View Place.

SAN FRANCISCO — Points of interest in world-famed city include Fisherman's Wharf, Golden Gate Park, Mission Dolores, Civic Center, Chinatown and Fleishhacker Zoo. Take buses A, B, C, E, F, G, H, K, L, N, O, R or W across Bay Bridge to Transbay Transit Terminal. (San Francisco transit maps available at Terminal)

SNOW MUSEUM, Border Lake Park — Extensive collection of birds, mammals and reptiles from Africa and the Arctic. Take buses 11, 12, 18, 34, 42, 51 or 58 to 19th St., Oakland. Short walk to museum at 19th and Harrison.

SWIMMING POOLS — Fresh water swimming during summer months in numerous East Bay municipal pools. Phone Transit Information for location, 653-3535. City owned plunges in Richmond and Hayward are open year around except December and January. To Richmond, take buses 72 or L to Garrard and Standard. To Hayward, take buses 32, 82, 91 or R to Mission and Pinedale.

TROUT PONDS, Leona Park — Equipment available free of charge to fish in 100-foot long, naturalistic "Sierra Stream". Park also contains fly casting pools and barbecue and picnic facilities. Take buses 15 or 15D to Mountain and Carson, Oakland.
