SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS.

1. Employee in train service must be familiar with Indianapolis Union Railway Book of Rules. The operation of trains over Union Tracks is governed by these rules and by special instructions. Employes must provide themselves with

2. When approaching hand thrown switches, train employes must observe the indication of switch targets and know that they are set in proper position be-

fore using them.

8. All trains and engines not equipped with regulation train signals, must display signals as follows:

BY DAY: Red or Yellow flag on rear of train

BY NIGHT: White light (or headlight) to the front of train, red light

4. When cars are pushed by an engine a trainman with proper signals must be stationed on forward end of head car. In such instances the forward end of train must (except in switching) be equipped with back-up hose. When practical back-up movements must be avoided.

5. The location of trains in Union Station is under the supervision of the Station Master. Unless otherwise directed, trains arriving at Union Station must pull to the farthest end and stop as indicated by signal from Car Inspectors.

6. When switching on Union Tracks, cars must not be cut off while in motion and air must be coupled up and in proper working order at all times.

7. Passenger trains must not be delayed by other trains or engines.

8. In order to prevent annoyance to passengers in and around Union Station, employes will as far as possible prevent, steam or hot water falling on platform employes with a late a possible protection and the state of engine bell or whistle, engines "popping off", and the escape of water or black smoke from stack.

9. Electric headlight must be kept dimmed while engine is on Union Tracks. 10. Dumping grates or cleaning ash pans on Union Tracks is prohibited.

11. Conductors must see that toilet room doors in all passenger equipment are kept locked while in Station, except when sanitary receptacles are applied to cars. Garbage or other refuse must not be thrown from dining or other cars while on Union Tracks.

12. When train is set for loading or unloading passengers, conductors must see that vestibule doors of all cars in their trains are kept closed, except on side

next to platform.

18. Trains must not depart from Union Station until starting signal is received. Conductors must not call for starting signal until leaving time, and until

all station work is completed and train is ready to move.

- 14. Conductors and trainmen of outgoing trains must report for duty at proper time and supervise the loading of passengers. Before permitting passengers to board cars, trainmen must ascertain their destination and if they have proper transportation. When passengers are destined to a station located on more than one railroad, special care must be exercised to see that they board the right
- 15. Courteous treatment must in all cases be accorded the traveling public and special care taken to avoid short or curt answers which may give offense. Unnecessary noise, such as loud talking, whistling, careless handling of equipment, etc., in the vicinity of occupied sleeping cars is prohibited.

16. Accidents or serious detentions must be immediately reported to Station Master.

17. All trains and engines moving over Union Tracks must proceed with caution, prepared to stop within a distance seen to be clear. Speed must not exceed 15 miles per hour over Union Tracks nor 12 miles per hour on "Wye". 18. Employes must understand and obey emergency horn signals in interlocking territory:

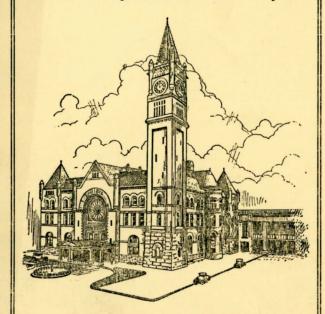
(a) One long blast-All trains within interlocking limits stop immedi-

Two short blasts-Resume normal movement after receiving the proper signal or permission from the signalman. Three short blasts-Whistle or horn test.

- (d) Four short blasts—Call signal maintainer.
 Sand must not be used within the limits of an interlocking plant. During freezing weather, engine must not be permitted to stand over interlocked switches if possible to avoid it.
- 19. Trains handling freight equipment must not use tracks under Union Station Trainsheds with men on top of cars, on account of insufficient overhead
- 20. Trucks must be stored on lower level, except that a reasonable number may be parked at end of platform outside trainsheds. Platforms must not be unnecessarily obstructed or trucks allowed to foul tracks at any time. Four wheel trucks left unattended on train level platform must be locked.
