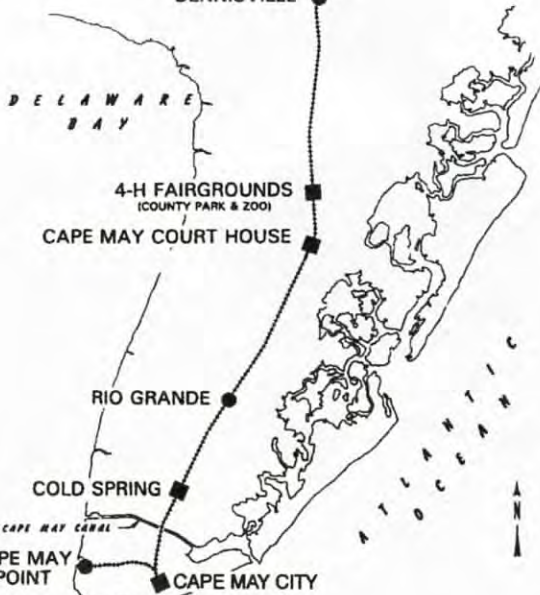
MAP OF
CAPE MAY SEASHORE LINES



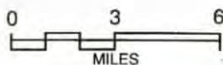

ALL ABOARD.....
CAPE MAY SEASHORE LINES... for a comfortable, relaxing trip back in time when taking the train to the shore was an exciting and memorable experience. Enjoy the same experience **TODAY** as you ride the original equipment operated in South Jersey by the Pennsylvania-Reading Seashore Lines, the Reading Company and the Pennsylvania Railroad.



It's Sunday, July 19, 1953...a beautiful summer morning...and you're trackside with noted rail photographer Bob Long as you stand back and watch Pennsylvania-Reading Seashore Lines (P-RSL) train No. 1053, a Philadelphia to Wildwood Express, with Pennsylvania Railroad (PRR) K4s Pacific-type locomotive No. 5022 and 12 cars, scooping water "on the fly" (note the spray under the tender) at the Ancora track pans, approximately one and a half miles north of Winslow. Picking up water at speed, one of the steam era's most impressive sights, saved considerable time by allowing locomotives to replenish their water supply (necessary to provide steam) without having to stop for water. As most steam locomotives were equipped with water scoops on their tenders, 2,000 to 3,000 gallons of water could be received in a matter of seconds while passing over a track pan, which averaged 1,500 feet in length and was situated between the rails. Water for the track pans was generally supplied from a nearby (and sometimes open top) water tank and fed to the pans from an adjacent pumphouse. Water plugs (standpipes) were available for those locomotives not equipped with water scoops. In addition to the P-RSL, the PRR and several other northeast railroads utilized track pans at various locations throughout their systems. Use of the Ancora track pans was discontinued during August of 1954. Today, the track pans are but a fond memory and another page in the history of southern New Jersey railroading.

DIRECTIONS TO SEASHORE LINES RAIL STATIONS

4-H FAIRGROUNDS RAIL STATION

From Route 47: Turn at traffic light onto Route 657/South Dennisville Road in South Dennis and proceed south approximately 5 miles, turning right at the first traffic light into the 4-H Fairgrounds Rail Station.

From Route 9: Turn at Route 657 in Cape May Court House and proceed north to the second traffic light, turning left into the 4-H Fairgrounds Rail Station.

From the Garden State Parkway: Turn at Exit 10A in Cape May Court House onto Route 657. Proceed north to the third traffic light, turning left into the 4-H Fairgrounds Rail Station.

COLD SPRING VILLAGE RAIL STATION

From Route 47: Turn at Route 9 in Rio Grande and proceed south three miles to the Cold Spring Village Rail Station, located on the right side of Route 9.

From the Garden State Parkway: Take Exit 4A in Rio Grande to Route 47. Proceed north on Route 47 to the second traffic light at the intersection of Route 47 and Route 9. Turn left onto Route 9 and proceed south three miles to the Cold Spring Village Rail Station, located on the right side of Route 9.

From the Cape May - Lewes Ferry: Leave the Ferry terminal and proceed north on Route 9 approximately 3 ½ miles (through four traffic lights) to the Cold Spring Village Rail Station, located on the left side of Route 9.

From Cape May City: Follow Route 633 or Route 622 to Route 109. Proceed north on Route 109 through three traffic lights to the fourth traffic light where Route 109 becomes Route 9. Follow Route 9 north approximately six-tenths of a mile to the Cold Spring Village Rail Station, located on the left side of Route 9. Alternate Route: Follow Route 626 to Route 9. Turn right onto Route 9 and proceed north approximately one mile to the Cold Spring Village Rail Station, located on the left side of Route 9.



CAPE MAY SEASHORE LINES, WEST JERSEY CHAPTER-NRHS, CELEBRATE THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE PENNSYLVANIA- READING SEASHORE LINES

BUDD RAIL DIESEL CARS, PART II

On Saturday, June 9, 2001, the Cape May Seashore Lines, in cooperation with the West Jersey Chapter of the National Railway Historical Society, will be celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the second and final group of Pennsylvania-Reading Seashore Lines (P-RSL) Budd Rail Diesel Cars (RDCs)! The event will begin at 11:00 a.m. at the new Cape May City Transportation Center/Rail Terminal (shortly after the arrival of Cape May Seashore Lines Train No. 301). The Budd Company of Philadelphia, originator of the RDC concept, delivered the P-RSL's initial order for six cars during September and October of 1950. Impressed by the performance and overall success of these cars, the Railroad ordered six additional cars, their second and final order for RDC's, which were delivered during May and June of 1951. This brought the total number of Budd Cars (Model RDC1) purchased by the P-RSL to 12. Between 1950 and 1982, these cars were used in high speed passenger service between Philadelphia or Camden and Atlantic City, Ocean City, Wildwood, Cape May City and Millville. From May 1996 to the present, the cars are operated by Cape May Seashore Lines in passenger service in Cape May County. Although modern in appearance, the fully-refurbished Budd Cars, built during the steam-era and now a half-century old, operated side by side with Pennsylvania Railroad, Reading Company and Pennsylvania-Reading Seashore Lines steam locomotives during the first seven years of their lives and are just as historically significant as the locomotives they replaced.

The celebration will feature several guest speakers, including former P-RSL engineers, conductors and other operating department personnel. Railroad photographs, publications and other railroad memorabilia will be on display and offered for sale by the West Jersey Chapter, NRHS. Commemorative P-RSL Budd Rail Diesel Car 50th Anniversary T-shirts will also be available and refreshments will be served. Additionally, passengers riding Seashore Lines Train No. 301, departing the 4-H Fairgrounds Rail Station on Route 657 in Cape May Court House at 10:00 a.m., will receive a commemorative souvenir. Round-trip fares between the 4-H Fairgrounds and Cape May City are \$8.00 for adults and \$5.00 for children (2 through 12). Seating is limited and commemorative souvenirs will be available on a first-come basis only. For additional information, call 608-884-CMSL (2675) or 609-884-5300.
